### Entries

Open to any professional, or any amateur with a USGA Handicap Index not exceeding 3.4, who turns 50 on or before July 30. Entries close June 10.

### Starting Field

156 players

### Schedule of Play

- Thursday, July 30 — First round (18 holes)
- Friday, July 31 — Second round (18 holes)

After 36 holes, the field will be cut to the low 60 scorers and ties, and any player within 10 strokes of the leader.

- Saturday, Aug. 1 — Third round (18 holes)
- Sunday, Aug. 2 — Fourth round (18 holes)

### Playoff

In case of a tie after 72 holes, a 3-hole aggregate score playoff will immediately follow. If this playoff results in a tie, the tied players will immediately continue to play off hole-by-hole until the winner is determined.

### Sectional Qualifying

18 holes stroke play, scheduled at 42 sites from June 22 – July 7.

## Romero Wins the 2008 Championship

Eduardo Romero shot 6-under-par 274 to win the 2008 U.S. Senior Open by four strokes over Fred Funk at The Broadmoor's East Course in Colorado Springs, Colo., to become the second Argentine winner of the championship, joining Roberto De Vincenzo (1980).

Romero, 54, joins De Vincenzo and 2007 U.S. Open champion Angel Cabrera as the third USGA champion from Argentina. He held onto a 54-hole lead over the longest course in Senior Open history (7,254 yards), despite shooting a 3-over-par 73 in the final round.

"I win this tournament," said Romero, who was playing in his second Senior Open. "I take the trophy home, two U.S. Opens now in Argentina. Cabrera won the U.S. Open and then I won this one. It's fantastic. It's very nice for the Argentine golfers, for South America, for the young golfers, for everybody."

Romero, who began the final round with a two-stroke lead over Funk, birdied the par-5 third hole to increase his lead to three. Funk, who shot 2-under 278, then birdied the seventh hole to narrow the gap back to two.

The long-hitting Argentine, who was second in driving distance for the week, staked his lead to three strokes

with a 30-foot birdie putt on the 10th hole, but then bogeyed four consecutive holes (11-14).

But Funk was unable to capitalize on Romero's bogey string because of his own bogey on the 11th hole and a costly triple bogey on the 13th, where he pulled his drive into deep rough. That swing gave Romero a comfortable four-stroke edge with four holes to play.

"I started to make bogey before that," said Romero, the first international winner since 1997. "But, I can't stop. I don't see Fred's scoring. I'm trying to make pars. Then, he makes triple bogey and I'm a little relaxing. My concentration was different after that."

Romero, who led the field in birdies (17) and greens in regulation (55 of 72), finished his final round as solidly as he had played through the first 54 holes by making par on the final four holes.

Mark McNulty finished third at 279, followed by Greg Norman at 280 and John Cook at 280.



"This is important, very important because we are working very hard for golf in Argentina," said Romero, who is known as El Gato (The Cat). "It is a dream to win the tournament and finally my dream's coming true. I'm back to Argentina with this cup. It's mine!"

Eduardo Romero was the first international winner since Graham Marsh (Australia) in 1997 ... he is the fifth international winner overall ... Romero is the second Argentine to win the Senior Open, following Roberto De Vincenzo in 1980 ... he is the third Argentine USGA champion, joining Angel Cabrera (2007 U.S. Open) and De Vincenzo (1980 U.S. Senior Open) ... he is also the 103rd international USGA champion ... Romero became the first to hold a 54-hole lead and win since Bruce Lietzke in 2003 ... his four-stroke margin of victory was the larg-

est since Tom Weiskopf in 1995 ... there were 27 USGA champions in the field including defending U.S. Senior Open champion Brad Bryant and eight other past champions – Dale Douglass (1986), Allen Doyle (2005 and 2006), Dave Eichelberger (1999), Bruce Fleisher (2001), Hale Irwin (1998 and 2000), Peter Jacobsen (2004), Larry Laoretti (1992), Dave Stockton (1996) and Don Pooley (2002) ... the field also included seven U.S. Open champions: Hubert Green (1976), Irwin (1974, 1990), Tom Kite (1992), Scott Simpson (1987), Curtis Strange (1988, 1989), Tom Watson (1982) and Fuzzy Zoeller (1984) ... 13 countries were represented in the field including Argentina, Australia, Canada, England, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Scotland, Spain, United States, Wales and Zimbabwe ... 30 amateurs were in the field ... Douglass, 72, played in his 23rd U.S. Senior Open ... at 7,254 yards, The East Course was the longest in Senior Open history ... Rick Cloninger of Fort Mill, S.C., tied a record with the lowest score by an amateur with his first-round 68 ... Fred Funk's 6-under-par 134 through 36 holes was the second-lowest 36-hole total in Senior Open history, trailing the 133 of six players previously ... Jeff Klein tied the nine-hole scoring mark with a 30 on his first nine in the third round ... Danny Green of Jackson, Tenn., was the low amateur after sharing the honor in 2007 ... Mark McNulty, who finished third, was the only player in the field without a three-putt.

## Championship History

The first U.S. Senior Open Championship was played June 26-29, 1980, on the East Course of Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck, N.Y.

Established as a result of the remarkable growth in senior golf, both at the professional and amateur levels, the championship attracted 631 entries.

The inaugural Senior Open was conducted for golfers 55 and older, with a handicap limit of eight strokes for amateurs.

The field included former U.S. Open champions Lew Worsham, Julius Boros, Ed Furgol, Jack Fleck, and Tommy Bolt. Former U.S. Amateur champion William C. Campbell was also a competitor.

Roberto De Vicenzo, a national hero in his native Argentina, won with a score of 285, one over par. He was four strokes ahead of Campbell, the runner-up.

In 1981, the USGA lowered the age minimum to 50 to make the championship more competitive. The USGA also believed that lowering the minimum age would place the Senior Open in the mainstream of other senior competitions.

The second Senior Open was won by another national hero, Arnold Palmer, 51, at Oakland Hills Country Club in Birmingham, Mich. Palmer won in an 18-hole playoff with Bob Stone and Billy Casper. With his victory, Palmer joined JoAnne Carner as the only players to win three different USGA championships (Jack Nicklaus, Carol Semple Thompson, and Tiger Woods have since accomplished this feat).

In 1982, at the Portland (Ore.) Golf Club, Miller Barber won the first of his three Senior Opens. Barber shot a final-round 65 and set the 72-hole scoring record of 282. He also captured the 1984 and 1985 championships.

Dale Douglass broke Barber's record in 1986 with a 72-hole score of 279. In 1987, Gary Player lowered Douglass's record by a remarkable nine strokes when he shot a 72-hole score of 270 at Brooklawn Country Club in Fairfield, Conn., to win. He was the only player to shoot four rounds in the 60s until Tom Weiskopf turned the trick in 1995.

Weiskopf shot 69-69-69-68—275 on the Blue Course of Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Md., to win.

U.S. Open champions have performed extremely well in the U.S. Senior Open, winning 10 of the 28 championships. The growth of senior golf has meant steadily increasing fields for the U.S. Senior Open. In 2002, a record 3,101 entries were accepted by the USGA.

The final two rounds of the U.S. Senior Open were broadcast live on national television beginning with the championship's 1980 inaugural. It has been telecast nationally ever since.

Don Pooley and Tom Watson staged the first 3-or-4 hole playoff in 2002. The format was installed in 1999. Pooley won with a birdie on the fifth hole. His 63 in the third round was the lowest score in Senior Open history to that point.
