CHAMPIONSHIP

Eligibility

Entries are open to male amateur golfers who: (a) will not have reached their eighteenth birthday by midnight of July 24, 2004 and (b) have up-to-date USGA Handicap Indexes not exceeding 6.4 under the Men's USGA Handicap System.

Entries are subject to rejection at any time (including during the Championship) by the USGA. The reason for rejection may include unbecoming conduct.

Age: Players are required to list their ages and dates of birth on all USGA entry forms.

Amateur Status: All players must conform with the USGA Rules of Amateur Status as specified in the USGA Rules of Golf.

International Players: International players must also conform to Rule 4-1 of the USGA Rules of Amateur Status. These players may not accept expenses from outside sources unless specifically permitted by the USGA Rules of Amateur Status. For more information, see Rule 4-1 of the USGA Rules of Amateur Status.

Entries: Form, Fee, Closing Date

All players, including those exempt, must apply on USGA forms. Forms may be obtained from the USGA office (form attached) or website (www.usga.org). Only those players for whom blank entries are filed by the USGA as noted in the section on exemptions will not be required to submit entry applications. *Only one entry may be filed per player. The USGA reserves the right to disqualify anyone who submits more than one entry.*

Entry fee of \$20 must be paid by every player. Entry fee will be refunded regardless of reason if the USGA (908-234-2300) is notified before the close of entries. After the close of entries, fee will be refunded in the event of injury or illness, if requested by July 19. No refund for any reason after July 19. A \$10 service charge will be deducted from all refunds.

**Time limit for entries means time of receipt at USGA (not

early to allow ample time for delay or error in transmission.
The risk of delay or error in transmission lies solely with the
entrant and the USGA will have no liability with respect to
any such delay or error and the consequences therefrom,
including rejection of the entry.**

Schedule

Competition will be in three stages:

1. **Sectional Qualifying—36 holes stroke play** for all except exempt players listed herein. (Note: Because of the size of the field, an 18 hole cut may be necessary at some Sectional Qualifying locations. This may not be possible to determine until after entries close.) Schedule inside.

2. **Championship—156 players eligible**, including exempt players.

(A) **STROKE PLAY—36 holes stroke play** to determine 64 qualifiers for match play. All sectional qualifiers and exempt players must compete. A tie for last qualifier's place will be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off.

MONDAY, JULY 19: —First round, 18 holes.

TUESDAY, JULY 20: —Second round, 18 holes.

(B) **MATCH PLAY—General numerical draw** will be used. For purposes of determining places in the draw, ties in qualifying rounds will be decided by a blind draw, except that places of those participating in a play-off will be determined by the order on the public scoreboard summary and by performance in the play-off. All matches at 18 holes.

WEDNESDAY, JULY 21: A.M.—First round.

THURSDAY, JULY 22: A.M.—Second round.

P.M.—Third round.

FRIDAY, JULY 23: A.M.—Quarterfinal round.

P.M.—Semifinal round.

SATURDAY, JULY 24: A.M.—Final round.

In the event of a tied match, (a) the winner will be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off and (b) the stipulated round is deemed to extend to as many holes as are required for a match to be won.

Prizes

CHAMPIONSHIP

WINNER—Gold medal and custody of the Championship trophy for the ensuing year, subject to such conditions as USGA may establish.

RUNNER-UP—Silver medal.

OTHER SEMIFINALISTS—Bronze medals.

LOWEST QUALIFYING SCORER—Bronze medal; if a tie, duplicate medals will be

awarded.

NO OTHER REMUNERATION—By his application, the player acknowledges that he is not entitled to remuneration of any kind for participation in the Championship other than prizes above.

SECTIONAL QUALIFYING

LOWEST SCORER FOR 36 HOLES IN EACH LOCATION: Silver medal; if a tie, duplicate medals will be awarded.

Expenses

If a player did not graduate from secondary school prior to September 1, 2003, he may accept outside help with his expenses. For more information, see Rule 4-2b of the USGA Rules of Amateur Status.

Rules of Golf; Close of Competition

Play will be governed by the Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA. Questions will be settled by the USGA Executive Committee, whose decision will be final. The competition is deemed to be closed when the Championship trophy has been presented.

Golf Balls

Only brands of golf balls on the most current USGA List of Conforming Golf Balls may be used. This list is updated monthly and may be found on the USGA website at www.usga.org or by contacting the USGA Technical Department at (908) 234-2300. The so-called "One-Ball Rule", the optional condition prescribed in Appendix I of the Rules of Golf, will be in effect.

Footwear

It is a condition of the competition, including at all qualifying sites and the championship proper, that shoes with traditionally-designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (if such metal may come in contact with the course) are prohibited during the stipulated round. Penalty for breach of this condition: DISQUALIFICATION.

Caddies

Qualifying Rounds — A player may provide his own caddie. If he wishes the host club to furnish a caddie, he should ask the Official in Charge because sufficient caddies may not be available at the host club.

Championship proper—A player may provide his own caddie. If he wishes to have a caddie provided to him by the host club, he must complete the information as outlined in the Memorandum to Contestants which he will receive once his eligibility for the Championship is confirmed.

EXCEPTION: A player may not use a parent, step parent, or guardian as a caddie during Sectional Qualifying or the Championship proper.

PENALTY: See penalty clause for breach of the condition on transportation prescribed in Appendix I of the Rules of Golf.

A player is not required to employ a caddie for any stage of the Championship.

Transportation

Players must walk at all times during a stipulated round. The optional condition prescribed in Appendix I of the Rules of Golf will be in effect.

Anyone (player or caddie) seeking a golf cart due to a disability as defined under the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) should log onto www.usga.org/champs/ada or contact the USGA at (908) 234-2300 to obtain information on procedures for submitting such requests. All such requests and required information must be submitted to the USGA **together with the entry application, all of which must be submitted in writing** by no later than 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 2, 2004. Please note that requests due to temporary injuries or impairments that do not qualify as a "disability" under the ADA will not be granted.

Time of Starting

The optional condition for time of starting prescribed in Appendix I of the Rules of Golf will be in effect.

Publicity and Promotion; Broadcasting

The USGA may arrange for (i) promotion of the Championship, for radio and television broadcasting and other exhibition and publication of the Championship or excerpts thereof in various media, including so-called "online" or "new media" and (ii) the design, manufacture and sale of merchandise which commemorates or memorializes the Championship, throughout the world. By this application, the player consents to the use by the USGA, or persons authorized by the USGA, of his name, likeness, voice and references to him and photographs and other images of him and his play connected with his appearance in the Championship, or any portion(s) thereof, in connection with such media promotion, broadcasting and other exhibition and publication of the Championship and design, manufacture and sale of commemorative merchandise. The USGA may utilize the rights granted it hereunder in connection with the promotion and/or commemoration of the 2004 Championship as well as future Championships, other USGA Championships and the USGA.

The cooperation of players with authorized representatives of the media is required, provided that no pre-Championship activities outside of those activities which are part of the Championship will be required and provided that the player's Championship play is not unreasonably interfered with.

CHAMPIONSHIP (Continued)

Registration at The Olympic Club

By 2 P.M. on SATURDAY, JULY 17, eligible players must:

1. Register in person at The Olympic Club; or
2. State arrival time directly to USGA Headquarters, c/o The Olympic Club, 524 Post Street, San Francisco, CA 94102-1295. Phone (415) 587-4800. Place may be forfeited by a player from whom no word has been received by 2 P.M. on SATURDAY, JULY 17.

Practice Privileges

Privileges of The Olympic Club are extended to qualified players in the Championship on Friday (afternoon only), July 16, and all day on Saturday, July 17 and Sunday, July 18. Players may sign up for practice rounds only after registering at The Olympic Club.

Accommodations

Information concerning accommodations will be provided to qualifiers upon completion of Sectional Qualifying. Exempt players will receive this information from the USGA office. An effort will be made to provide housing in private homes for those who desire it.

Players' Dinner

SUNDAY, JULY 18-6:30P.M.—The USGA cordially invites all players to a dinner in their honor at The Olympic Club. An invitation will be given to each player in the packet of information he will receive upon completion of Sectional Qualifying.

QUALIFYING

Qualifying Location; Transferring

Players' preferences of Sectional Qualifying locations must be designated on the entry. If a qualifying location has more players than can be accommodated, some players may be transferred to another location and the date for qualifying may be different than the original requested date. Transfer will be based on the date of receipt of entry application, i.e., players filing applications late will be subject to transfer. Transfers are final. Transfer from one qualifying location to another is not permissible after entries close.

Sectional Qualifying will be over 36 holes. (Note: Because of the size of the field, an 18-hole cut may be necessary at some Sectional Qualifying locations. This may not be determined until after entries close.)

Qualifiers' Places; Ties; Substitutions

The number of qualifiers' places in each location will be determined by the USGA after entries close, based on size and playing quality of the field.

A tie for the last qualifier's place or an alternate's place will be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off.

Substitutions in order of qualifying scores will be allowed for qualifiers unable to compete in the Championship.

If a Sectional Qualifying location cannot fill its qualifiers' places, or if an exempt player withdraws, the place made available will be reallocated to another location. A reallocation schedule will be prearranged by the USGA.

If a player withdraws before playing a stroke in the Championship proper, a substitution is allowed. Only the USGA may make such substitutions.

Alternates have no status at the Championship.

Acceptance of Places; Notice of Withdrawal

On the day of Sectional Qualifying, every qualifier should notify the Official in Charge whether he will play in the Championship.

If a qualifier or an exempt player withdraws, he must notify the USGA (908-234-2300) promptly in order to insure an alternate fair opportunity to play. Failure to comply may result in disqualification from future USGA competition.

Exemptions

Players in the following categories will be eligible for exemption from Sectional Qualifying (if otherwise eligible). Exempt players who wish to participate in the Championship must file an entry. Exempt players need not meet the handicap requirement.

*(NOTE: The USGA will file blank entries for those players who become exempt after the close of entries.)

1. All winners of the U.S. Junior Amateur Championship.
2. Runners-up of the U.S. Junior Amateur Championship the last three years (2001 - 2003).
3. Semifinalists of the U.S. Junior Amateur Championship the last two years (2002 - 2003).
4. Quarterfinalists from the 2003 U.S. Junior Amateur Championship.
5. Anyone who has qualified for match play at a U.S. Amateur Championship.
6. *Winners of the U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship the last two years (2003 - 2004).
7. *Runner-up of the 2004 U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship.
8. *Winners of the British Amateur Championship the last five years (2000 - 2004).
9. Playing members of the 2001 & 2003 United States and Great Britain & Ireland Walker Cup Teams.
10. Playing members of the 2000 & 2002 United States Men's World Amateur Teams.
11. *Anyone who has qualified for a U.S. Open Championship.
12. *Special exemptions as selected by the USGA.

Conditions; Schedules

The USGA Executive Committee reserves the right to alter any of the conditions and schedules herein. The decision of the Executive Committee in any matter will be final.

Personal Appearance: Sectional Qualifying and Championship Proper

Players must be neat in appearance with respect to personal grooming and clothing.
