

## **Spectator Information Guide**

Welcome to the 108th United States Open Championship.

The United States Golf Association is conducting the 2008 Championship on the beautiful South Course at Torrey Pines Golf Course, which overlooks the dramatic coastline of San Diego, Calif.

Torrey Pines is municipally owned and this is only the second time that the Open has been conducted on a public course. In 2002, the Championship was played on the publicly owned Black Course at Bethpage State Park in Farmingdale, N.Y. This Open marks the first time the National Championship has been played in San Diego and the first time since 1948 that it has been conducted in Southern California.

The South Course at Torrey Pines promises to be a challenge for the world's greatest players. It will be the longest setup in U.S. Open history, with various tee positions that can stretch the course to as long as 7,643 yards. The South Course was designed by noted golf architect William P. Bell in 1957. Recent renovations were completed under the direction of another famous American golf architect, Rees Jones. We are confident that the Open will once again identify a deserving champion.

Every effort has been made to provide convenient access to and from the course, as well as to secure the best viewing opportunities for spectators. This easy-to-read guide contains suggestions that we hope will make your experience more enjoyable.

We hope your memories of this National Championship will be lasting ones, memories of a wonderful golf course, thrilling competition at the very highest level and most importantly, a renewed affection for the unique spirit of integrity and sportsmanship that makes golf the greatest game of all.

### **TORREY PINES GOLF COURSE**

California has consistently provided dramatic sites for National Championships of the United States Golf Association. The 2008 U.S. Open marks the 67th USGA Championship and the tenth U.S. Open in the state, but it is the first time the Open will be played at Torrey Pines Golf Course. The Championship will be contested on Torrey Pines' South Course, which was designed in 1957 by noted golf architect William P. Bell. Another well-known American golf architect, Rees Jones, has overseen widely praised renovations to the course in preparation for the championship.

Sprawling atop cliffs towering above the Pacific Ocean, the course boasts dramatic views of the coastline and deep ravines. Wildlife is plentiful. Bounded by mountains to the north and the Pacific to the west, the course often basks in sunshine but can be swept by rain, fog and chilling winds.

### **U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**

In 1894, the first U.S. Open was conducted on Oct. 4 on the nine-hole course of Newport (R.I.) Golf and Country Club. Ten professionals and one amateur started in the 36-hole competition, which included four trips around the Newport course in one day. The surprise winner was Horace Rawlins, 21, an English professional who was the assistant at the host course. He scored 91-82—173 with the gutta percha ball and

won the \$150 first prize.

Only four golfers have won the Championship four times.

## **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS**

All times (PDT) and schedules listed are subject to change due to suspension(s) of play.

### **Pre-Championship Merchandise Opening at the Main Merchandise Pavilion**

June 5 through June 8 (10 a.m. to 6 p.m.). No ticket is necessary to enter the Main Merchandise Pavilion during this pre-Championship opening. The golf course and other facilities will be closed to the public.

### **Practice Rounds**

Players will have the option of starting Practice Rounds at the first or 10th tee. Players electing to play a full round generally begin somewhere between 7 a.m. and 2 p.m. It is typical for some players to be on the golf course or Practice Areas until dusk.

Monday (June 9) (Gates open – 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

Tuesday (June 10) (Gates open – 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

Wednesday (June 11) (Gates open – 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

### **Championship Rounds 1 and 2**

Play is scheduled to begin at 7 a.m. from both the first and 10th tees. The last pairings each day will begin play at 2:42 p.m. and finish at approximately 7 p.m.

Thursday, June 12th (first round)

(Gates open – 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

Friday (June 13) (second round)

(Gates open – 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

### **Championship Rounds 3 and 4**

The first starting time will be determined by the number of players who make the “cut” at the conclusion of the second round (60 players with the lowest scores including ties plus any player within 10 strokes of the lead). Generally, the first pairing begins play from the first tee between 8-8:30 a.m.; the last pairing for both days will start play from the first tee at approximately 2:50 p.m.

Saturday (June 14) (third round)

(Gates open – 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

Sunday (June 15) (fourth round)

(Gates open – 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.)

### **Playoff**

If there is a tie for the lead at the end of 72 holes, an 18-hole playoff will be held on Monday (June 16). The

playoff will begin at approximately 9 a.m. and finish at approximately 1 p.m. Gates will open at 7 a.m.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### American Express

### ATMs

ATMs will be located next to the Main Merchandise Pavilion, Trophy Club and Main Admission Gate.

### Autographs

Spectators should keep in mind that the players' first responsibility during U.S. Open week is to compete for the National Championship. For this reason, a "no autograph" policy is in effect throughout Championship week. Spectators should not approach a player for an autograph from the time immediately preceding the player's starting time up to and including the player's completion of his round, including the time when the player is at the Practice Areas or en route to his first tee. This policy applies to Practice Rounds as well as Championship Rounds.

### Camera Policy

Cameras and camcorders are only allowed on site at the course during Practice Rounds, Monday through Wednesday, for personal photographic use only and without their cases.

### Corporate Hospitality

USGA Corporate Hospitality facilities are located on site. Only the specific ticket for each corporate hospitality facility provides access into that facility. Children will also need the specific corporate hospitality ticket to gain access into corporate hospitality facilities since regular Junior tickets do not provide access. ### Disabled Spectators

The USGA is pleased to provide the following services to our spectators with disabilities:

- Accessible parking spaces will be available at all Championship parking areas.
- Wheelchair accessible vehicles will be available to transport spectators with disabilities to and from the course.

- Our Disabled Services Committee will be on site to transport spectators to and from admission gates and designated viewing areas around the course.

- Motorized scooters will be available for spectators with disabilities, on a first-come, first-served basis, compliments of the USGA and Pride Mobility.

- TTY's/TDD's will be located in the Disabled Services Tent at the Main Admission and the USGA/Media Admission Gates.

- Accessible restroom facilities will be available at port-a-let locations throughout the course.

### **First-Aid Stations**

First-Aid Stations will be located at the Main Admission Gate and the Practice Range. A handful of satellite first-aid stations will be located around the course. All first-aid stations will be staffed with emergency medical technicians. If a medical emergency arises, please notify a U.S. Open volunteer or USGA official.

### **Food and Beverage Service**

There will be approximately 20 concession stand locations on the course that will have food and beverages for purchase.

### **Grandstands**

Grandstands will be located at strategic viewing areas. There is no reserved grandstand seating; seating is provided on a first-come, first-serve basis.

### **Junior Tickets**

Juniors 12 and younger will be admitted free of charge, on any day, when accompanied by a valid adult ticket holder. These tickets will be available at the Will Call facilities and all Admission Gates.

Juniors 13 to 17 will be admitted at a reduced rate when accompanied by a valid adult ticket holder. These tickets can be purchased by credit card at the Will Call facilities and all Admission Gates. Practice Rounds \$15; Championship Rounds \$30.

### **Lexus**

Some of the merchandise available for purchase includes caps, shirts, T-shirts, sweaters, jackets, lanyards, artwork, lapel pins, golf balls, ball mark repair tools, ball markers, towels and much, much more.

Acceptable forms of payment are: U.S. dollars, travelers checks, **American Express**, Discover, MasterCard, Visa and debit cards. Personal checks are not accepted. Satellite Merchandise Tents will be located at the Main Admission Gate and the food court between Holes 9, 15 and 17.

June 9 – 15 (Monday through Sunday)

Since the Main Merchandise Pavilion and Satellite Merchandise Tents are located on the Championship grounds, you must have a U.S. Open ticket or credential to gain entry to the Main Merchandise Pavilion and Satellite Merchandise Tents during Championship week.

### **Program Vouchers**

A voucher for an official 2008 U.S. Open Program may be redeemed at any information booth or in the Main Merchandise Pavilion.

### **Restroom Facilities**

Portable restroom facilities including facilities for spectators with disabilities will be located throughout the course.

### **Security**

We appreciate your patience and cooperation with all of the U.S. Open's security procedures.

Spectators, volunteers and staff will not be allowed on the shuttle buses or through an Admission Gate with

any of the items listed below. Please be sure to read the following list of prohibited items carefully:

**No Cases and/or Covers** (such as chair or umbrella covers)

**No Signs, Posters and/or Banners**

**No Televisions and/or Radios**

**No Food and/or Beverage**

**No Containers and/or Coolers**

**No Pets** (other than service animals)

**No Lawn and/or Folding Armchairs**

**No Bicycles**

**No Ladders**

**No Metal-spiked Golf Shoes**

**No Weapons** (regardless of permit, including but not limited to firearms or knives)

**No other items deemed unlawful or dangerous by the USGA and/or Championship Security Personnel, in their sole discretion.**

### **Spectator Guidelines**

If you observe the following guidelines, your experience at the U.S. Open will be a more enjoyable one:

- **Your U.S. Open ticket must be displayed at all times.**

- **Please stay behind gallery ropes and cooperate with the marshals at all times.**

- **Please be considerate of others and kneel or sit if you are in the front row of the gallery.**
- **Drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.**
- **To ensure your safety at all times, walk carefully and never run.**
- **The U.S. Open involves substantial walking on grassy hills, dirt paths and other uneven surfaces. Please wear appropriate footwear such as sneakers.**

### **TRANSPORTATION**

Torrey Pines Golf Course is located approximately 15 miles north of downtown San Diego, Calif.

#### **Car**

Complimentary general spectator parking will be provided at Qualcomm Stadium in the Mission Valley area of San Diego, located about 13 miles southeast of the golf course. Complimentary transportation will be provided to and from the Main Admission Gate. This shuttle bus ride should take 25 - 30 minutes depending on traffic. Please note: There is no general spectator parking available in the immediate vicinity of the golf course. All other parking is by permit only.

The San Diego Metropolitan Transit System Trolley provides convenient, regular service to Qualcomm Stadium from various points in the San Diego area including Mission Valley (Green Line), Downtown (Blue Line to Green Line) and East County (Orange Line to Green Line). A variety of MTS Day Passes make travel easy and economical and can be purchased at Trolley Station ticket machines, at the Transit Store in downtown or in advance on the MTS Web site [www.sdmts.com](http://www.sdmts.com). Travel Tips for the U.S. Open: Travel early and allow plenty of time to get to Qualcomm Stadium and transfer to the Championship shuttle buses that will take you to the U.S. Open.

#### **Passenger, Taxi or Limousine Drop-Off**

Passenger, Taxi or Limousine drop-off will only be allowed at the designated area in close proximity to the Main Admission Gate. There is no parking or standing, so please coordinate pickup times accordingly. Due to traffic restrictions, access is limited to vehicles no larger than a 15 passenger van or limousine. Please follow signs to the appropriate drop-off location.

### **SPECTATOR DIRECTIONS TO QUALCOMM STADIUM**

#### **From points North using Interstate 5**

Take Interstate 5 South to Exit 20 (Interstate 8 East). Take Interstate 8 East for approximately 3.5 miles and Exit Right following signs to Qualcomm Way. Take Qualcomm Way for approximately .5 miles and turn Right onto Friars Road East. Follow Friars Road East for approximately 1.5 miles and turn Right into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **From points North using Interstate 15**

Take Interstate 15 South to Exit 7 (Friars Road). Turn Right on Friars Road West for approximately .5 miles. Turn Left into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **From points South using Interstate 805**

Take Interstate 805 North to Interstate 15 North. Take Interstate 15 North to Friars Road West Exit. Turn Right on Friars Road West for approximately 1 mile. Turn Left into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **From Downtown using Freeway 163**

Take Freeway 163 North to Friars Road East Exit. Follow Friars Road East for approximately 2.25 miles. Turn Right into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **From points East using Interstate 8**

Take Interstate 8 West to Interstate 15 North. Take Interstate 15 North to Friars Road West Exit. Follow Friars Road West for approximately 1 mile. Turn Left into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **From points West using Interstate 8**

Take Interstate 8 East to the Qualcomm Way Exit. Exit Right following signs to Qualcomm Way. Take Qualcomm Way for approximately .5 miles and turn Right onto Friars Road East. Follow Friars Road East for approximately 1 mile. Turn Right into Qualcomm Stadium.

#### **Trophy Club**

The Trophy Club is an exclusive on-site, air-conditioned tent that is conveniently located behind the second and fifth tee with comfortable seating and televisions for live U.S. Open coverage. Trophy Club tickets are needed to access this tent. Food and beverage is available for additional purchase. Sample menu items include made-to-order omelets, scrambled eggs, bacon and fresh fruit in the morning and Philly cheese steak, grilled chicken and blackened mahi mahi sandwiches along with fish tacos in the afternoon. Coffee, soda, beer, wine and mixed drinks are available. Acceptable forms of payment are: U.S. dollars, travelers checks, **American Express**, Discover, MasterCard and Visa. Upscale, air-conditioned restrooms are conveniently

located adjacent to the tent.

### **TV Viewing**

A 12' x 16' television screen will be located adjacent to the clubhouse and the Practice Area.

### **Weather**

Average June temperatures range from a high of 90 degrees to a low of 50 degrees. Please remember to wear sun protection: sunscreen, hats and sunglasses.

### **Weather Warning**

The USGA will have meteorology staff on site monitoring the possibility of inclement weather. If inclement weather is approaching, special "weather warning" signs like the one to the left will be posted on leaderboards around the course. When the sign appears, spectators are advised to take immediate precautions (including clearing grandstands) PRIOR to play being suspended. In the event of a weather warning, please avoid: open areas, hilltops, high places, isolated trees, golf carts and wire fences. If play is suspended, which will be indicated by one prolonged air-horn blast, please close your umbrella and seek shelter. In the event of a suspension of play, grandstands will be cleared immediately.

### **Will Call**

There will be two Will Call facilities conveniently located on site for spectators to drop off and pick up tickets. The Main Will Call will be located at the Main Admission Gate and Will Call 2 will be located at the USGA/Media Admission Gate. Photo identification will be required to pick up any tickets left at Will Call. Will Call facilities cannot be accessed by vehicles at anytime.

### **Ticket/Credential License Agreement**

The United States Golf Association (the “USGA”) has established the following terms and conditions under this Ticket/Credential License Agreement (this “Agreement”) for the use of “Tickets” to the 2008 United States Open Championship (the “Championship”) to be held at Torrey Pines Golf Course, San Diego, Calif. from June 9, 2008 through June 15, 2008 and including any day or days as may be occasioned by a postponement or play-off of any round or rounds. Any individual possessing a valid and legal Ticket and/or Credential shall be deemed a “Ticket Holder” for the purposes of this Agreement. This Agreement outlines the rights and responsibilities of a Ticket Holder and applies to the sale of all Tickets including sales over the Internet. Additional copies of this Agreement may be obtained by calling (800) 698-0661 or by going to the USGA’s Web site at [www.usga.org](http://www.usga.org).

Please read this entire Agreement carefully. By accepting a Ticket, a Ticket Holder certifies that he or she has accepted each of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

#### 1. Delivery of Tickets.

(a) Upon receiving any and all Tickets, the Ticket Holder is solely responsible for safeguarding all Tickets. Tickets are valuable and should be treated like currency. Tickets that are lost, stolen, forgotten, mutilated or destroyed will not be replaced. Tickets that are unreadable due to mutilation of any kind will not be accepted for admission.

(b) The Ticket Holder acknowledges and agrees that he or she (i) is responsible for any and all Tickets he or she gives to any third party and (ii) will notify any such third party of the existence and applicability of this Agreement. Any such third party receiving any Ticket or Tickets will be deemed to have accepted each of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

#### 2. Admission.

(a) The Ticket is a revocable license. The Ticket may be revoked without refund or other consideration and the Ticket Holder may be removed from the Championship for (i) failure to comply with any term of the Ticket and/or this Agreement; (ii) failure to obey any posted signs and/or instructions of the Championship marshals and officials and/or (iii) acting in a dangerous or disorderly manner. The license granted by the Ticket may also be terminated by tendering to the Ticket Holder the purchase price of the Ticket. The Ticket Holder has the sole responsibility for complying (or causing any applicable third party to comply) with the Championship Code of Conduct outlined below, as well as all of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

(b) All disputes concerning a Ticket to the Championship and/or the Ticket Holder’s rights thereunder and all other disputes and matters whatsoever arising under, in connection with or incident to this Agreement (including but not limited to disputes relating to Ticket orders and attendance by a Ticket Holder at the Championship and all other matters covered by this Agreement) shall be governed by New Jersey law and shall be litigated, if at all, in and before a court of competent jurisdiction located in New Jersey, to the exclusion of the courts of any other county, state or country.

(c) Anyone attempting to alter or reproduce the Ticket in whole or in part will be prosecuted under the law.

Resale or attempted resale of the Ticket at a price higher than face value of the Ticket is grounds for seizure or automatic cancellation without refund or other compensation. Ticket sales on or near the grounds associated with the Championship at any price are prohibited. Tickets sold on or near the grounds associated with the Championship are subject to revocation or cancellation without refund or compensation. The Ticket may not be used for or in advertising, promotions (including contests and sweepstakes), or other trade or commercial purposes without the express written consent of the USGA. The Ticket Holder is admitted on the condition that he or she agrees not to transmit or sell or aid in transmitting or selling any description, account, picture or reproduction of the Championship. In addition to all other rights and/or remedies available to the USGA, breach of the foregoing will automatically terminate the Ticket without refund or other compensation.

(d) Each person, regardless of age, must have a Ticket for admission to the Championship.

(e) Dates and times of the Championship are subject to change at any time, either before or during the Championship. The USGA reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to delay, postpone or cancel the Championship for any reason, including weather conditions and safety related issues. There will be no refunds of Tickets as a result of a change in the date or time of the Championship or for any other reason unless a Ticket Holder qualifies for a refund under the Cancellation Policy set forth below.

(f) The USGA is the only authorized seller of Tickets. Tickets obtained from sources other than representatives of the USGA, including but not limited to auction sites, may be lost, stolen or counterfeit and in such cases will not be honored. In addition, Tickets obtained in contravention of the terms of the Ticket and/or this Agreement will not be honored. The USGA has no responsibility for Tickets purchased through an unauthorized source. Ticket Holders in possession of Tickets that have been reported as lost or stolen are subject to removal from the Championship and may be referred to local authorities for investigation.

### 3. Accessibility to Persons with Disabilities.

The USGA does not discriminate on the basis of disability and will, subject to availability, make accommodations for ticketed individuals with disabilities.

### 4. Postponement and Cancellation Policy.

(a) Ticket Holder acknowledges and agrees that (i) any and all decisions relating to a cancellation and/or postponement of the Championship shall be made by the USGA, in its sole discretion, and (ii) Ticket Holder shall adhere to such decisions in connection with its obligations under this Agreement.

(b) There will be no on-site refunds for the cancelled Championship. Refunds, if available, will be made by the USGA only to the Ticket Holder.

### 5. Championship Code of Conduct.

(a) The following is a list of disallowed and restricted items and activities within the Championship: cell phones (including cell phones with photographic capabilities), PDAs and/or other Portable Email Devices, noise-producing electronic devices, cameras and/or camcorders (other than Monday through Wednesday for personal non commercial photographic use only and without their cases), bags larger than 8"W x 8"H x 8"D in their natural state, cases and/or covers (such as chair or umbrella covers), signs, posters and/or banners, televisions and radios, food and/or beverages, containers and/or coolers, pets (other than service animals), lawn and/or folding armchairs, bicycles, ladders, metal-spiked golf shoes, weapons (regardless of permit, but not limited to firearms or knives) and/or any other items deemed unlawful or dangerous by the USGA and/or

Championship Security Personnel, in their sole discretion.

(b) For security or other purposes consistent with the license granted by the Ticket, the Ticket Holder consents to the reasonable inspection of his/her person and property before entering and/or during the Championship. The USGA reserves the right to refuse admission to the Championship or eject any person refusing such procedures or where a search produces contents or items deemed unlawful, dangerous or prohibited by the USGA, in its sole discretion. Disallowed or improperly used permitted items will be confiscated. Permitted items left unattended will be removed by security personnel for future pick-up. The USGA is not obligated to hold any item for a period of time longer than the end of play on the day the item was confiscated by the USGA, nor is the USGA liable for the value of any confiscated and/or unattended item. Any Ticket Holder refusing inspection or otherwise refusing to abide by the USGA's rules and safety regulations may be denied entry to the Championship or may be removed from the Championship, all without a refund to such Ticket Holder. Any Ticket Holder found with illegal items may be referred to local authorities for investigation.

(c) As a condition to receiving a Ticket and entry to the Championship, each Ticket Holder grants permission to the USGA, the City of San Diego and The Friends of Torrey Pines, LLC and/or their respective agents, their third party assigns and/or grantees to utilize in perpetuity the holder's image, likeness and/or voice incidental to any live or recorded television or video display or other transmission or form of reproduction in whole or in part of the Championship, without compensation.

(d) In addition to the foregoing, the USGA reserves the right to refuse admission to or remove any Ticket Holder who (i) fails to comply with the Championship Code of Conduct; (ii) in the opinion of the USGA, is disruptive to the Championship or the enjoyment, comfort or safety of other spectators or (iii) breaches any of the terms or conditions in this Agreement.

(e) A "no autograph" policy is in effect throughout Championship week. Spectators should not approach a player for an autograph from the time immediately preceding the player's starting time up to and including the player's completion of his round, including the time when the player is at the Practice Range and Practice Green or en route to his first tee. This policy applies to Practice Rounds as well as Championship Rounds. Violation of this policy by the Ticket Holder will automatically terminate this license without refund or other compensation.

#### 6. Disclaimer and Limitation of Liability and Scope of this Agreement.

(a) The Ticket Holder expressly assumes all risks incidental to and associated with the attendance at the Championship for which the ticket entitles the Ticket Holder to attend. By virtue of the Ticket Holder's attendance at the Championship, the Ticket Holder agrees and understands all risks incidental to and associated with his/her attendance, including but not limited to being struck by a golf ball or golf club, and hereby waives, releases and discharges the USGA, the City of San Diego and The Friends of Torrey Pines, LLC and affiliated companies and vendors, and participating players, and all employees, officers, directors, agents, representatives, and/or volunteers associated with the Championship, and understands and agrees to hold harmless all of the persons, associations and entities listed above, from any and all claims for damages for death, personal injury or property loss or damage including all costs and expenses, which result from the Ticket Holder's attendance at the Championship. It is further understood and agreed that this waiver, release and assumption of risk is binding on the Ticket Holder's heirs and assigns.

(b) Tickets to the Championship are sold by the USGA on an "AS IS" basis without warranties or

representations of any kind, either express or implied, other than those warranties that are implied by and incapable of exclusion, restriction or modification under New Jersey law. IN NO EVENT WILL THE USGA OR ANY OTHER PERSON INVOLVED IN ANY WAY WITH THE USGA'S TICKETING PROGRAM BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, DIRECT, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, OR FOR LOST PROFITS, CLAIMED BY ANY TICKET HOLDER IN CONNECTION WITH ANY OF THE MATTERS COVERED BY THIS AGREEMENT, whether for breach of contract, tortious behavior, negligence, or any other cause of action, other than the exclusive remedies expressly outlined in this Agreement.

(c) This Agreement together with the Ticket contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters outlined in this Agreement, and supersedes all previous written or oral agreements or understandings between the parties with respect to such subject matter.
