



116th U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP – ROUND TWO NOTES

DUSTIN JOHNSON

- After missing his first two greens, **Dustin Johnson** hit 25 consecutive greens in regulation in the first and second rounds. That is the most in the U.S. Open since 1997. The previous best was 20 by Billy Horschel (2013) and Morgan Hoffmann (2015).
- **Johnson** started the U.S. Open by playing 27 consecutive bogey-free holes. That is the most to start a U.S. Open since Rory McIlroy played the first 35 holes without a bogey in 2011. It is the most at any point in a U.S. Open since Martin Kaymer played 29 consecutive bogey-free holes in 2014 (over the first, second and third rounds).
- **Johnson** (67-69) is one of two players to open with two rounds in the 60s in a U.S. Open at Oakmont. The other is Hale Irwin (69-69) in 1994.
- **Johnson** has been in the top 10 in eight consecutive major championships through 36 holes. Note: He did not play in the 2014 PGA Championship.

- **Johnson's** 1-under 69 in the second round is his fifth consecutive round of par or better in a major championship. He has shot rounds of par or better in 23 of his last 30 rounds in major championships, going back to the 2014 U.S. Open.
- In **Johnson's** nine U.S. Open appearances, he has been in the top 5 after 36 holes four times.
- **Johnson** has held the lead in the U.S. Open at the conclusion of four rounds (third round, 2010; first and third rounds, 2015; second round, 2016).

PLAYERS

- **Daniel Summerhays** shot a 30 on the inward nine in the second round. That is the lowest inward-nine score in a U.S. Open at Oakmont and ties Ernie Els (front nine, third round, 1994) for lowest nine-hole score in a U.S. Open at Oakmont.
- **Summerhays'** and **Louis Oosthuizen's** 65s are the lowest rounds in a U.S. Open at Oakmont since Loren Roberts' 64 (third round, 1994).
- **Oosthuizen's** eight birdies in the second round are the most in a single round of the U.S. Open since Tiger Woods' eight birdies in the third round of the 2010 U.S. Open.
- **Jim Furyk** is the only player in the field to have made the cut in three U.S. Opens at Oakmont (1994, 2007, 2016). Jack Nicklaus is the only player to make the cut in four U.S. Opens at Oakmont (1962, 1973, 1983, 1994).
- **Scott Piercy** (T-3, 2-under 138) is playing in his fifth U.S. Open and 13th major championship. He has just one top-25 in his previous majors.
- **Sergio Garcia** (T-3, 2-under 138) made his ninth consecutive cut in a U.S. Open. That is the longest current streak.
- **Jason Day** has now made the cut in 14 consecutive major championships. That is the longest current streak.
- **Jon Rahm** is the first amateur to make the cut at a U.S. Open at Oakmont since 1983.
- **Gregory Bourdy** (T-3, 2-under 138) has the best 36-hole position by a Frenchman in a major since Thomas Levet was tied for second in the 2002 Open Championship. Arnaud Massey is the only Frenchman to win a major championship, the 1907 Open Championship.
- **Lee Slattery** hit all 14 fairways in the second round.
- **Peter Hanson** was disqualified for signing for an incorrect score on the 11th hole in the second round.
- **Henrik Stenson** withdrew before the completion of the second round. Stenson opened with a 1-under 69, but was 10 over par through 16 holes of his second round.

CUT

- Sixty-seven players made the cut of 6-over 146 or better. That is the lowest cut in eight U.S. Opens at Oakmont. The previous low was 147 in 1994, though it should be noted that the course played as a par 71 that year.

COURSE

- In the first and second rounds, there were **five par 4s that measured less than 400 yards** (Holes No. 2, 5, 11, 14, 17). That is the most in a U.S. Open since the third round in 2013 at Merion, when six par 4s measured less than 400 yards.

17TH HOLE

- On the 17th hole, players attempted to **drive the green** 208 times and laid back 101 times in Rounds 1 and 2.
 - Those who went for it averaged 3.82 strokes.
 - Those who laid back averaged 4.08 strokes.
 - Nine percent of those who tried to drive the green were successful.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY

- Second-round play was suspended Friday at 8:42 p.m. EDT due to darkness. Fifty players completed their second rounds on Friday. Play resumed at 7 a.m. EDT on Saturday and the second round concluded at 2:27 p.m. EDT. The third round commenced at 3 p.m. EDT.
