



116th U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP – DAY TWO NOTES

PLAYERS

- After missing his first two greens, **Dustin Johnson** hit 25 consecutive greens in regulation in the first and second rounds. That is the most in the U.S. Open since 1997. The previous record was 20 by Billy Horschel (2013) and Morgan Hoffmann (2015).
- **Johnson** started the U.S. Open by playing 27 consecutive bogey-free holes. That is the most to start a U.S. Open since Rory McIlroy played the first 35 holes without a bogey in 2011. It is the most at any point in a U.S. Open since Martin Kaymer played 29 consecutive bogey-free holes in 2014 (first, second and third rounds).
- **Johnson** (67-69) is one of two players to open with two rounds in the 60s in a U.S. Open at Oakmont. The other is Hale Irwin (69-69) in 1994.
- **Johnson** has been in the top 10 in seven consecutive major championships through 36 holes. If his position holds, it will be his eighth in a row. Note: He did not play in the 2014 PGA Championship.

- **Johnson's** 1-under 69 in the second round is his fifth consecutive round of par or better in a major championship. He has shot rounds of par or better in 23 of his last 30 rounds in major championships going back to the 2014 U.S. Open.
- **Daniel Summerhays** shot a 30 on the inward nine in the second round. That is the lowest inward-nine score in a U.S. Open at Oakmont and ties Ernie Els (front nine, third round, 1994) for lowest nine-hole score in a U.S. Open at Oakmont.
- **Summerhays'** 65 is the lowest round in a U.S. Open at Oakmont since Loren Roberts' 64 (third round, 1994).

- **Jim Furyk** (T-7 through 35 holes) is one of four players (Ernie Els, Phil Mickelson, Jeff Maggert) in the field to play in the 1994 and 2007 U.S. Open at Oakmont.
- **Scott Piercy** (T-4, 2-under 138) is playing in his fifth U.S. Open and 13th major championship. He has just one top-25 in his previous majors.
- **Sergio Garcia** (T-4, 2-under 138) is in position to make his ninth consecutive cut in a U.S. Open. That is the longest current streak. Phil Mickelson (T-93 through 34 holes) could also join him.
- **Lee Slattery** hit all 14 fairways in the second round.
- **Peter Hanson** was disqualified for signing for an incorrect score on the 11th hole in the second round.

COURSE

- In the second round, there were **five par 4s that measured less than 400 yards** (Holes No. 2, 5, 11, 14, 17). That is the most in a U.S. Open since the third round in 2013 at Merion, when six par 3s measured less than 400 yards.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY

- Play was suspended at 8:42 p.m. EDT due to darkness. Fifty players completed their second rounds on Friday. The wave of 78 players that was originally scheduled to start on Friday afternoon will begin from Holes 1 and 10 starting at 7 a.m. EET. For the 27 players still on the course at the end of Friday, play will resume at 7:15 a.m. EDT on Saturday.
