



116th U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP – PARTIAL ROUND ONE NOTES

- Scottie Scheffler (69) is the first amateur to break 70 at Oakmont since Vinny Giles (69) in the second round of the 1973 U.S. Open.
- World No. 624 Andrew Landry leads the first round of the 2016 U.S. Open. The last player ranked that low to lead the U.S. Open at the conclusion of a round was Justin Hicks (No. 662) in the first round of the 2008 U.S. Open.
- Andrew Landry could be the first player since Brendon de Jonge (first round in 2010) to hold a lead at the conclusion of a round in his first U.S. Open.
- The 684-yard 12th hole is the longest hole in U.S. Open history. The previous longest hole was the 671-yard 16th from the third round of the 2012 U.S. Open, held at The Olympic Club's Lake Course.
- The three suspensions of play are the most in a U.S. Open since the first round at Merion Golf Club in 2013, when there were also three suspensions.
- The first suspension of play was at 10:04 a.m. EDT. Play resumed at 11:23 a.m. EDT. The second suspension of play was at 12:07 p.m. EDT. Play resumed at 2:33 p.m. EDT. The third suspension of play was at 3:51 p.m. EDT. All suspensions were due to dangerous weather conditions.
- Nine players completed their opening rounds. That is the fewest number of players to complete an opening round on Thursday since the 2009 U.S. Open when no players finished on Thursday at Bethpage State Park's Black Course.
