



## 116th U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP – ROUND ONE NOTES

### PLAYERS

- World No. 624 **Andrew Landry** is the first-round leader of the 2016 U.S. Open. The last player ranked that low to lead the U.S. Open at the conclusion of a round was Justin Hicks (No. 662) in the first round of the 2008 U.S. Open.
- **Landry** is the first player since Brendon de Jonge (first round, 2010) to lead at the conclusion of a round in his first U.S. Open.
- **Landry's** 66 is the lowest opening round in the nine U.S. Opens contested at Oakmont.
- **Landry's** 66 is the lowest opening round by a player competing in their first U.S. Open since T.C. Chen's 65 in 1985.
- **Scottie Scheffler** (69) is the first amateur to break 70 in a U.S. Open at Oakmont since Vinny Giles (69, second round, 1973).
- **Lee Westwood's** 3-under 67 is his ninth round of par or better in his last 10 in major championships.
- **Dustin Johnson's** 3-under 67 is his fourth consecutive round of par or better in a major championship. He has shot rounds of par or better in 22 of his last 29 rounds in major championships going back to the 2014 U.S. Open.
- **Jordan Spieth's** 2-over 72 breaks a streak of nine consecutive opening rounds of par or better in major championships.
- **Dustin Johnson** was the only player in the field to record no bogeys in the first round. It is the first bogey-free round at Oakmont since Loren Roberts (third round, 1994).
- **Angel Cabrera**, the 2007 U.S. Open champion at Oakmont, opened with an even-par 70. The last player to defend his U.S. Open title at the same course was Jack Nicklaus at Baltusrol (1967 and 1980).

## COURSE

- The **684-yard 12th hole** is the **longest hole in U.S. Open history**. The previous longest hole was the 671-yard 16th from the third round of the 2012 U.S. Open at The Olympic Club.
- Eleven players broke par in the first round. That is the **most players to break par in an opening round at Oakmont**, breaking the previous high of nine in 1994. It is the most players under par in any round at Oakmont since the third round in 1994 when 15 players broke par.
- Three holes (Nos. 4, 14, 17) played under par in the first round. In 2007, no holes played under par for the entire championship.

## WEATHER

- The three **suspensions of play** are the most in a U.S. Open since the first round at Merion in 2013, when there were also three suspensions.
- The first suspension of play was at 10:04 a.m. EDT on Thursday. Play resumed at 11:23 a.m. The second suspension of play was at 12:07 p.m. Play resumed at 2:33 p.m. The third suspension of play was at 3:51 p.m. All suspensions were due to dangerous weather conditions.
- Only **nine players completed their opening rounds on Thursday**. That is the fewest number of players to complete an opening round on Thursday since the 2009 U.S. Open at Bethpage State Park, where no players finished on Thursday.
- In total, **2.97 inches of rain** fell at Oakmont between Thursday and Friday morning.
