2014 Conditions of Play

Conducting Organization

The International Golf Federation, previously known as the World Amateur Golf Council, which comprises national governing bodies of golf in 130 countries and international professional tours, conducts the Women's World Amateur Team Championship. The IGF is the international federation for golf for the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

Host Organization

The Japan Golf Association is the host.

The Teams

May be two or three players per team.

Format

72 holes stroke play; 18 holes played on each of four days.

Scoring

In each round, the total of the two lowest scores by players from each team constitutes the team score for that round. The four-day total is the team's score for the championship.

Schedule of Play

- Sept. 3 — First round (18 holes)
- Sept. 4 — Second round (18 holes)
- Sept. 5 — Third round (18 holes)
- Sept. 6 — Fourth round (18 holes)

Miscellaneous

Players must be amateur golfers under the Rules of Amateur Status of The R&A and the United States Golf Association. Players must be nationals of the country represented.

Sites

The championship is rotated biennially among three geographic zones: Asia-Pacific, American and European-African. The 2016 championship will be played in Cancun, Mexico.

The Republic of Korea Wins the 2012 Championship

The Republic of Korea, with a total of 13-under-par 563, won the 2012 Women's World Amateur Team Championship (WWATC) at Gloria Golf Club in Antalya, Turkey, by three strokes, becoming the first team in 22 years to capture consecutive titles.

"We were struggling yesterday and we had a long conversation last night," said Korean coach Hyung-Mo Kang. "The beginning did not go so well, but they ramped it up at the end. I am very happy."

The last team to win in consecutive Espirito Santo Trophy competitions was the USA in 1988 and 1990. Korea won the 2010 WWATC in Argentina with a record-setting score of 546. The 2012 championship was its third gold medal as it took the title in 1996 as well.

Korea withstood a 7-under-par charge from Germany, which took the silver medal at 566. Finland, which also shot seven under for the day, shared the bronze medal with Australia at 567.

It is Germany's second medal all-time and first since tying for silver in 1998. Finland won its first medal in the competition and Australia took its first medal since winning gold in 2002.

"We play them annually at the Queen Sikirit Cup and every year we are chasing them," New Zealand captain Libby Steele said of the Korean Team. "They have fresh players every time and they just keep producing good golfers. It shows when you see them on all the Tours around the world."

Korea posted a 2-under-par 70 on Gloria's New Course from Kyu-Jung Baek and an even-par 72 from Hyo-Joo Kim, No. 3 in the Women's World Amateur Golf Ranking™. Min-Sun Kim shot a non-counting 74.

"Last night, we tried to forget about our score, forget about how many shots we were leading by and who was trying to catch us," Baek said. "We just tried to focus on playing well."

Spain and New Zealand tied for fifth at 568. The rest of the top 10 included: Canada in seventh at 569, the USA in eighth at 570, France in ninth at 572 and Japan in 10th at 574.

Although there is no prize awarded, Lydia Ko, 15, of New Zealand, No.1 in the WWAGR, set a championship mark for lowest individual score at 14-under-par 274. Ko, the reigning U.S. Women's Amateur champion and winner of the LPGA Tour's Canadian Open, broke the mark set in 2010 by Korea's Jung-Eun Han at 275.

Sweden's record of 24 consecutive Espirito Santo Trophy competitions with a place in the top 10 ended as the team tied for 13th.

The host team from Turkey finished tied for 36th.

The upper half of the draw played at Gloria Golf Club's New Course in the fourth round and the lower half played the Old Course.

The 2012 championship was hosted by the Turkish Golf Federation.

Round 1 — Sweden (New), at 3-under-par 141, by one stroke over Latvia (New). Round 2 — Korea (Old), at 8-under-par 280, by five strokes over Australia (Old), Canada (Old), Germany (New), Japan (New) and New Zealand (New). Round 3 — Korea (Old), at 11-under-par 42, by five strokes over New Zealand (Old).

Notes

A record 53 teams competed in the 25th Women's World Amateur Team Championship, surpassing the previous record of 52 teams in Argentina in 2010 ... Seven countries made their first appearances in the WWATC in Turkey: Bosnia and Herzegovina, Estonia, India, Poland, Serbia, Tunisia and Ukraine ... Turkey played in its fourth WWATC. Its best finish was 41st in 2004 in Puerto Rico ... Four members of the eight-player Texas State University women's golf team played: sisters Krista and Mara Puisite (Latvia), Iman Nordin (Malaysia) and Valdis Jonsdottir (Iceland) ... Great Britain and Ireland had four 2012 Curtis Cup Match players: Leona McGuire and Stephanie Meadow (Ireland), Charley Hull (England) and Amy Boulden (Wales). The USA had two Curtis Cup players: Austin Ernst and Lisa McCloskey ... Guam had the championship's youngest and oldest players: Mary Parsons, 13, and Tessie Blair, 57 ... Danish Team member Nicole Broch Larsen won the 2012 Turkish Amateur Open at Gloria Golf Club's New Course. She won by five strokes with a 4-under-par 284 that included a tournament-low 68 in the third round. She also won the 2011 title ... Maria Olivera, 38, played in her 11th Women's World Amateur Team Championship. Only two players in championship history have played in more: Elisabeth Nickhorn of Brazil (13) and Marina Ragher Buscaini (12) of Italy ... Italian Captain Anna Molinari, who played for Italy in 2010 at the WWATC, is married to Edoardo Molinari, a member of Europe's victorious 2010 Ryder Cup Team. He played for Italy in the 1998, 2000, 2002 and 2004 World Amateur Team Championships and won the 2005 U.S. Amateur Championship. They were married in April 2012. Her brother-in-law, Francesco Molinari, represented Europe at the 2012 Ryder Cup, which ran concurrently with the Espirito Santo Trophy competition ... Puerto Rico had the same three players in 2010 and 2012: Patricia Garcia, Kyle Roig and Maria Torres. They were the only team to do so. Garcia and Roig both played in their fourth WWATC ... USA Captain Carol Semple Thompson is a member of the

World Golf Hall of Fame (2008) and played in five Espirito Santo competitions, four of which were USA victories: 1974, 1980, 1988 and 1994. She also competed in 1992. Both of her parents served as captains of winning USA Teams. Her father, Harton Semple, captained the winning USA men's team in 1978 in Fiji and her mother, Phyllis, was the USA women's captain in the team's 1976 victory ... Semple Thompson replaced the late Barbara Douglas as women's captain. Douglas, a past USGA Women's Committee chairman, passed away in January 2012 following a battle with cancer.

Championship History

What began as a proposal for a match in 1964 between the USA and France grew into the Women's World Amateur Team Championship.

The impetus for this championship was an invitation by the French Golf Federation for the USA Curtis Cup Team to stop off in France for an informal match after that year's Curtis Cup Match in Wales.

The USGA accepted the invitation, but also suggested inviting other nations to create a women's counterpart to the World Amateur Team Championship. That event for men's teams began in 1958 after an invitation from Japan to establish a match between the two nations.

The French were delighted to sponsor the inaugural women's championship and arranged for it to be played at the St. Germain Golf Club, near Paris, in October 1964. The event, under the chairmanship of Vicomtesse de Saint-Sauveur, was a triumph.

A total of 25 teams and 75 players participated, which instantly established the competition as a member of international golf's family of championships. Spectator enthusiasm at the first championship was keen, since the host team prevailed over the USA by one stroke.

The French player Catherine Lacoste, who would later become a heroine of the amateur game when she won the 1967 U.S.

Women's Open, was a big factor in the excitement in her home country. Her final-round 73 secured the Espirito Santo Trophy for France. Lacoste tied with the USA's Carol Sorenson at 294 for medalist honors.

While no prize is given for individual scoring, Lydia Ko, 15, of New Zealand, set a championship mark for lowest individual score at 14-under-par 274 at the 2012 Women's World Amateur Team Championship. Ko, the reigning U.S. Women's Amateur champion and winner of the LPGA Tour's CN Canadian Open, broke the mark set in 2010 by Korea's Jung-Eun Han at 275.

In 1966, the World Amateur Golf Council assumed sponsorship of future Women's World Amateur Team Championships. Since its second-place finish in the inaugural, the USA has dominated, winning 13 times. Australia (1978, 2002), Spain (1986, 1992), Sweden (2004, 2008), France (1964, 2000) and Korea (1996, 2010) are the only other multiple victors.

For the first time, in 2002, the championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy was played on two courses.

In 2003, the organization's name was changed to the International Golf Federation.
