### **U.S. Women's Amateur Championship Trophy**

The Cox Trophy was presented in 1896 by Robert Cox of Gorgie, Edinburgh, Scotland, a member of Britain's Parliament. It is a two-foot-high silver vase of Etruscan design and the only USGA trophy donated by a person from another country. The Cox Trophy is the oldest survivor among trophies for USGA championships. The original is kept in the USGA Museum and Arnold Palmer Center for Golf History while a copy is handed yearly to the champion.

## Kang Wins the 2010 Championship

Danielle Kang had collected two medals at USGA championships in the last year. This time, she took home the trophy.

Kang, 17, of Thousand Oaks, Calif., earned a 2-and-1 victory over Jessica Korda, 17, of Bradenton, Fla., to claim the 2010 U.S. Women's Amateur Championship at the par-72, 6,559-yard Charlotte (N.C.) Country Club.

Kang, who earned stroke-play medalist honors at the 2009 Women's Amateur and at the 2010 U.S. Girls' Junior the month before arriving at Charlotte C.C., made a 4-footer for birdie on the 35th hole to claim her first national championship.

"It's so awesome," said Kang when asked to describe her emotions after winning the title. "I don't know, but I even told myself I don't understand why people cry when they win stuff, but now I do. You're just so happy you did it."

In the scheduled 36-hole final, Kang got off to a hot start, birdieing three of the first four holes. But Korda started equally well, with birdies on the first and third holes, to keep pace with Kang. Kang's birdie on the fourth hole gave her a 1-up lead, and a bogey from Korda on No. 5 put Kang 2 up.

Kang, who graduated high school early and started her freshman year at Pepperdine University in January 2010, held that 2-up lead going into the break between rounds.

Korda knew she had to be more aggressive heading to the afternoon round.

"I was a little tentative this morning," said Korda. "I was getting really frustrated with myself not only because I wasn't making, like I was making birdies, but then I was frustrated at her making birdies because I wasn't used to that. All week if I made a birdie then someone else would miss. Then I went to go take a shower [between rounds], and I felt completely calm and I thought I was going to get it back."

She almost did. A bogey by Kang on the 23rd hole allowed Korda to cut the deficit to 1 down, and a birdie by Korda from 4 feet on No. 27 squared the match.

Korda took her first lead of the day on the 30th hole when she hit her approach shot to within a foot, which was conceded for birdie. Kang hit her approach shot into a greenside bunker and was unable to get up and down.

But Korda's advantage would be short-lived. After the two traded pars at the 31st hole, Kang made a 5-footer for birdie on No. 32 to again square the match.

The turning point came at the par-4 16th hole, the 34th of the match. Korda's approach shot found a greenside bunker — her only missed green of the afternoon round — and she was unable to get up and down from 12 feet. Kang's birdie attempt from 40 feet went 5 feet past the hole and she converted the par putt to take a 1-up lead.

"I didn't know she was in the bunker, but I knew she had a chip and she short-sided herself," said Kang of Korda's approach shot on 16. "So I told my dad, middle of the green. That's all I need to do."

One hole later, Kang hit an 8-iron to 4 feet. After Korda missed her birdie try from 7 feet, Kang calmly made her birdie putt to claim the championship.

The final featured a display of excellent golf from both players. With the usual match-play concessions, Kang was the equivalent of five under par, and Korda was the equivalent of six under par.

Korda, a member of the victorious 2010 USA Curtis Cup Team, said the difference in the final was her putting.

"I was a little more conservative," said Korda, a high school senior. "But Danielle was just making birdie after birdie after birdie, birdies on top of my birdies, birdies before my birdies. It was a birdie barrage."

For Kang, it was the culmination of a journey that started at the 2010 U.S. Women's Open at Oakmont (Pa.) Country Club, where she made the cut but struggled with the difficult layout.

"When I medaled at the U.S. [Girls'] Junior, I was like, I always put myself down," said Kang. "I kept saying I can't putt, I can't do this. I was really negative. After Oakmont and the U.S. [Girls'] Junior I was like, 'I'm actually not that bad a player. I'm not that bad.'"

And now she is the 110th U.S. Women's Amateur champion.

### Leaders

Round 1 — Rachel Rohanna, at 7-under 65, by three strokes over Brooke Pancake and four strokes over Doris Chen and Jaclyn Sweeney. Round 2 — Rohanna, Sweeney and Erynne Lee were medalists at 6-under 138.

### Cut

At 7-over-par 151, with a 6-for-1 playoff that lasted two holes to determine the final match-play spots.

Hot and sunny throughout the week, with high humidity and temperatures in the mid-90s.

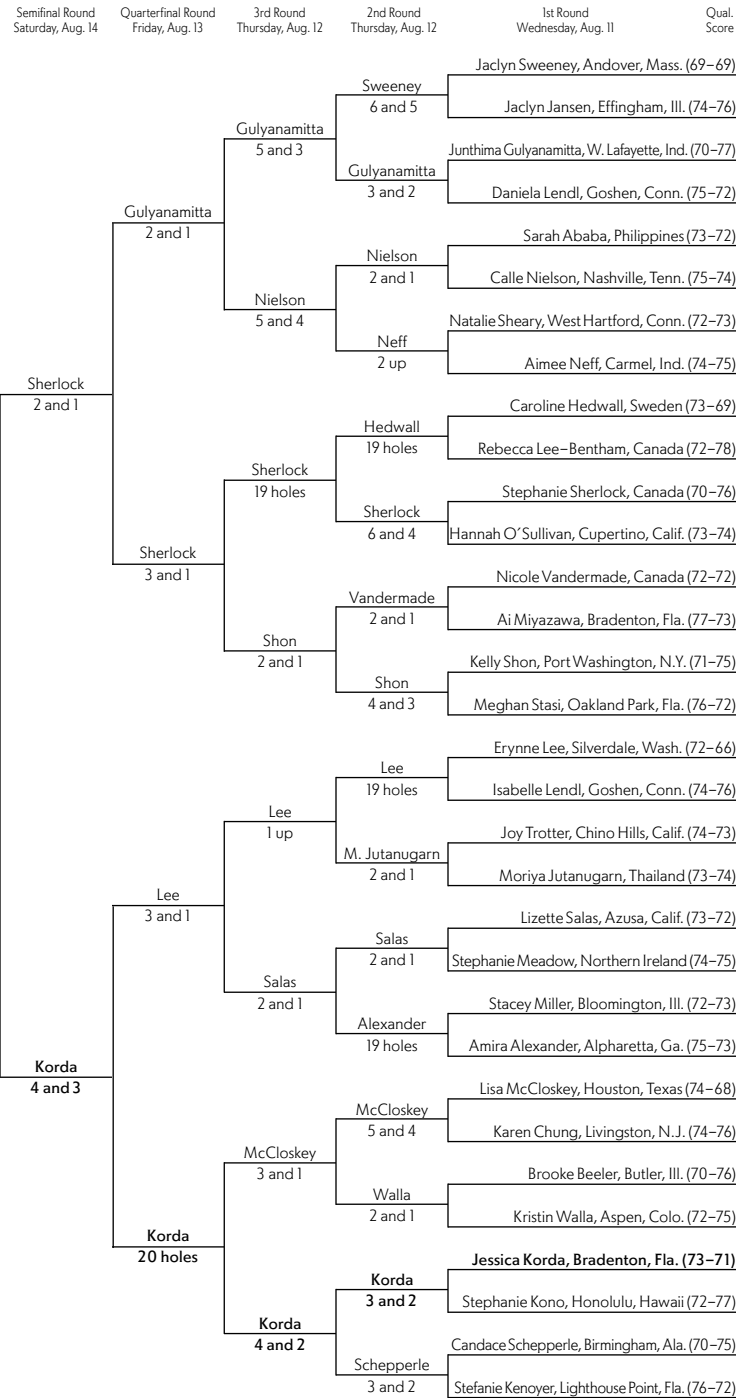
### Notes

Rachel Rohanna shot a 7-under 65 in the first round of stroke play to surpass the previous 18-hole scoring record for the Women's Amateur by one stroke ... The previous record of 66 was set by Kellee Booth in 1998, Natalie Gulbis in 1999 and Amanda Blumenherst in 2008 ... The average age of the 156 competitors in the field was 19.98 ... There were 80 players in the field who were competing in their first U.S. Women's Amateur, and 30 who were playing in their first USGA championship ... There were two 12-year-olds in the field: Hannah O'Sullivan and Lilia Khatu Vu ... The oldest player in the field was 58-year-old Carolyn Creekmore, the 2004 USGA Senior Women's Amateur champion ... Creekmore was one of eight USGA individual champions in the field, joined by Amy Anderson (2009 U.S. Girls' Junior); Doris Chen (2010 U.S. Girls' Junior); Martha Leach (2009 U.S. Women's Mid-

Amateur); Kristen Park (2007 U.S. Girls' Junior); Ellen Port (1995, 1996, 2000 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur); Meghan Stasi, (2006, 2007 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur); and Emily Tubert (2010 U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links) ... there was also one USGA team champion in the field — Laura Coble, who helped Georgia win the 2005 and 2009 USGA Women's State Team Championships ... In addition to the USA, there were 16 countries represented by the players in the field: Australia, Canada, Colombia, England, Ireland, Japan, Korea, Mexico, Northern Ireland, People's Republic of China, the Philippines, Scotland, South Africa, Sweden, Chinese Taipei and Thailand ... Canada, with 13 players, had the most of any foreign country ... There were three sets of sisters in the field: Ariya and Moriya Jutanugarn; Daniela and Isabelle Lendl; and Katie and Erynne Lee ... There were 1,049 entries received for the championship, the first time the Women's Amateur surpassed 1,000 entries.

## Championship History

The U.S. Women's Amateur Championship marks the beginning of women's competitive golf in this country. Along with the U.S. Amateur and the U.S. Open, the Women's Amateur was one of the USGA's first three championships.

The first Women's Amateur Championship was arranged one month after the 1895 Amateur and Open Championships.

The following small item appeared in the social column of a New York newspaper shortly after the completion of play: "Thirteen ladies played 18 holes of golf at the Meadow Brook Club, in Hempstead, recently. Mrs. Charles S. Brown, whose husband plays at the Shinnecock Hills Club, in Southampton, L.I., made the best score and thus won the United States championship for lady golfers."

Very few early golf clubs encouraged women to play. There were exceptions, of course, most notably Shinnecock Hills, whose private property the Women's Amateur title would become for the first four years. When Lucy Barnes Brown elected not to defend in 1896, Shinnecock came up with a replacement in Beatrix Hoyt, who would become its best-known player. Hoyt, the granddaughter of Supreme Court Chief Justice Salmon P. Chase, won the next three championships.

Although a stroke-play format was selected for the first championship, the Women's Amateur became a match-play competition in 1896 and has remained so since.

The most noteworthy champion is Glenna Collett Vare, a lifelong amateur who won the Cox Trophy a record six times. In the 1920s and 1930s, Vare was the darling of the sports world, much as Bob Jones was during that era.

Second only to Vare is JoAnne Gunderson Carner, who won five Women's Amateur Championships. Combined with her two wins in the U.S. Women's Open and a single win in the U.S. Girls' Junior, Carner's record of eight USGA titles is eclipsed only by Jones and Tiger Woods, who have each won nine.

Women's Amateur champions seem to have a remarkable facility to repeat. Hoyt, Alexa Stirling, Vare, Virginia Van Wie and Juli Simpson Inkster have all won the Women's Amateur three times consecutively. A noteworthy six champions — Genevieve Hecker, Dorothy Campbell, Margaret Curtis, Betty Jameson, Kay Cockerill and Kelli Kuehne — have won twice in succession.

The Women's Amateur has long identified some of golf's greatest women players, many of whom have gone on to successful professional careers. Along with the champions listed above, Patty Berg, Babe Didrikson Zaharias, Louise Suggs, Marlene Stewart Streit, Anne Quast Sander, Barbara McIntire, Catherine Lacoste, Carol Semple Thompson and Beth Daniel have all secured a place in women's golf history.
