2011 Conditions of Play

The Teams

The Walker Cup is played by male amateur golfers, one team from the United States of America and one team from England, Ireland, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales (GB&I). The teams consist of not more than 10 players and a captain.

The USA Team is selected by the United States Golf Association, and the GB&I Team by The R&A.

Schedule of Play

- Saturday, Sept. 10 — Four foursomes matches (18 holes each); eight singles matches (18 holes each)
- Sunday, Sept. 11 — Four foursomes matches (18 holes each); 10 singles matches (18 holes each)

Scoring

Victory in a match scores one point. When a match goes 18 holes without a decision, one-half point is awarded to each side.

Miscellaneous

The Match is held every two years, alternately in the United States of America and Great Britain and Ireland. The country winning the Match takes custody of the Walker Cup for the ensuing two years. In case of a tie, the cup stays with the previous winner until the next Match is played.

USA Wins the 2009 Match

Rickie Fowler and Peter Uihlein both went a perfect 4–0 to lead the United States of America to a 16½–9½ victory over Great Britain and Ireland at the 2009 Walker Cup Match at the 6,846–yard, par–70 Merion Golf Club in Ardmore, Pa.

It was the third consecutive win for the Americans, who now hold a 34–7–1 all–time record in the Walker Cup.

In Sunday morning’s foursomes (alternate shot), the USA Team won three of the four matches for the second consecutive day to build its lead to 11–5 heading into the afternoon’s 10 singles matches.

Cameron Tringale, 22, of San Juan Capistrano, Calif., posted an 8–and–6 victory over Luke Goddard to give the USA its 13th point and assured the Americans would retain the Walker Cup. Uihlein, 20, of Orlando, Fla., then earned a 3–and–1 win over Stiggy Hodgson to claim the trophy outright for the USA.

“It was a great week,” said Uihlein, who played in his first Walker Cup. “It’s definitely something I will never forget. We had a great team. We all get along great and we all just meshed well and played well together.”

Uihlein also made an 18–foot match–clinching par putt in his Saturday morning foursomes match that gave the USA a 3–1 lead after the Match’s first session and might have swung momentum in the favor of the hosts.

“The point was big because it was kind of a reversal,” said USA Captain George “Buddy” Marucci Jr. “To go from 2–2 to 3–1 is a big difference.”

Fowler, 20, of Murrieta, Calif., provided a huge boost for the Americans. Fowler, who earned the first point of Sunday afternoon for the USA squad with a 2–and–1 victory over Matt Haines, continued his stellar play in the Walker Cup. In 2007, he was 3–1 in leading the Americans to victory.

For Fowler, who turned professional immediately following the Match, the success at Merion was a perfect way to end his amateur career.

“The whole reason I waited around [to turn pro] was for this weekend,” said Fowler, the low individual scorer at the 2008 World Amateur Team Championship. “The days leading up to it and the practice we had was just an awesome experience, and to go 4–0 and get the Cup back, it can’t get any better. It’s going to be tough to top this weekend.”

Marucci, who also captained the Americans to victory in 2007, credited Fowler for his excellent play and leadership throughout the Match.

“I don’t know if anybody has played for the U.S. the way Rickie has played in the last two Walker Cups,” said Marucci, the 2008 USGA Senior Amateur champion who also played in the 1995 and 1997 Walker Cup Matches.

Also undefeated for the USA were Morgan Hoffmann (2–0–1) of Saddle Brook, N.J., and Bud Cauley (3–0–1) of Jacksonville, Fla. Hoffmann won his Sunday singles match, 1 up, over Wallace Booth, while Cauley halved with Chris Paisley. Brendan Gielow of Muskegon, Mich., added the final point for the USA with a 4–and–3 win over Dale Whitnell.

GB&I Captain Colin Dalgleish thought his team was capable of a comeback, but the Americans proved too much to handle.

“We got off to a great start in the morning in the foursomes, and that fell away and the lead became pretty much too much of a mountain to climb,” said Dalgleish, who was serving as the GB&I captain for a second consecutive Match. “Albeit, at one stage this afternoon, the board was looking very good for us, and it would have been just possible to maybe take eight points out of this afternoon and even to tie the Walker Cup, but then it kind of ran away from us again.”

2009 Match Notes

Weather

Cool and overcast with temperatures in the mid to high 60s on Saturday. Cloudy but eventually sunny with highs in the upper 70s on Sunday.

For the first time in 2009, the format for Sunday afternoon singles included 10 singles matches instead of the previous eight ... Three members of the Oklahoma State University team — Rickie Fowler, Morgan Hoffmann and Peter Uihlein — played for the USA ... Two members of the University of Georgia team — Brian Harman and Adam Mitchell — played for the USA ... Seven of the Great Britain and Ireland team members were from England, two from Scotland and one from Ireland ... Gavin Dear and Wallace Booth were members of the 2008 World Amateur Championship Team from Scotland ... The average age of the GB&I Team was 23 years, the USA 22 ... Nathan Smith of the USA was the oldest player on either team at age 31, and the youngest on either team was 18-year-old Tommy Fleetwood of England ... Two USA players were veterans — Rickie Fowler (2007) and Brian Harman (2005) ... Nearly three inches of rain forced the opening/flag-raising ceremonies to be held in a tent near the first hole on Friday ... With the Walker Cup Match being played at Merion, the four venues of Bob Jones' Grand Slam in 1930 (U.S. Open at Interlachen C.C. in Minnesota; U.S. Amateur at Merion G.C.; British Open at Royal Liverpool; and British Amateur at St. Andrews in Scotland) have all hosted the Walker Cup Match.

Match History

The Walker Cup Match began in the wake of World War I with a view toward stimulating golf interest on both sides of the Atlantic. The match grew in part out of two international matches between the USA and Canada, in 1919 and 1920.

At the same time, British and American amateurs considered each nation's national amateur championship a great plum. Meanwhile, the USGA Executive Committee had been invited to Great Britain for a series of meetings with the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews Rules Committee. The meeting was to look at the advisability of modifying various rules of the game. Among the participants was George Herbert Walker, USGA president in 1920.

Upon the Executive Committee's return to the United States of America, international team matches were discussed. The idea so appealed to Walker that he soon presented a plan and offered to donate a trophy. Walker had been a low handicap player and was a keen advocate of the game. When the press dubbed the trophy the Walker Cup, the name stuck.

In 1921, the USGA invited all golfing nations to send teams to compete in the Match, but no country was able to accept that year. The Americans stuck to their mission, however, and William C. Fownes, the 1910 U.S. Amateur champion, who had twice assembled the amateur teams that played against Canada, rounded up a third team in the spring of 1921 and took it to England. At Hoylake, the American team defeated a British team, 9-3, in an informal match the day before the British Amateur.

Early in 1922, The R&A announced that it would send a team to compete for the Walker Cup at the National Golf Links of America, Walker's home club, in Southampton, N.Y.

Originally, the competition was open to any country that might care to challenge. The USGA invited all countries to compete. Except for Great Britain, however, no other country was able to accept.

Fownes was the American captain for the inaugural match and his team consisted of Charles Evans Jr., Robert Gardner, U.S. Amateur champion Jesse Guilford, Robert T. Jones Jr., Max Marston, Francis Ouimet, Jess Sweetser and Rudolph Knepper, who did not play.

Robert Harris was captain of the British side, and his players were Cyril Tolley, Roger Wethered, Colin Aylmer, C.V.L. Hooman, W.B. Torrance, John Caven and W. Willis Mackenzie. Ernest Holderness, the British Amateur Champion, was unable to make the trip.

Bernard Darwin, the golf writer of *The Times* of London, had accompanied the team and wound up playing in the Match. When Harris fell ill, Darwin was invited to compete in his place and serve as playing captain. He defeated Fownes, 3 and 1. The American Team, however, prevailed, winning the first Walker Cup Match, 8-4.

Until recent years, the USA clearly dominated the series, but the number of American victories never clouded the true purpose of the Walker Cup Match. A much higher value has been placed upon the series as a medium of international friendship and understanding between The R&A and the USGA.

The Match was played on an annual basis until 1924, when it was decided that the financial strain of annual encounters was too severe. It was also believed that interest might drop if the Matches were played too frequently. A decision was made to meet in alternate years.

The series was interrupted by World War II after the 1938 Match at St. Andrews, Scotland. When the Match resumed, in 1947, St. Andrews was again selected as the site. Under normal peacetime conditions, the Match would have been played in the USA, but postwar economic conditions would have made the trip difficult for the British.

The USA leads the series, 34-7-1.

Jim Holtgrieve, 2011 USA Walker Cup Captain

Jim Holtgrieve, whose stellar amateur career includes a winning record as a player on three victorious USA Walker Cup Teams and an individual triumph at the inaugural 1981 U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship, is the captain of the 2011 USA Walker Cup Team.

"I'm elated to be given this honor by the USGA and to have the chance to captain 10 [outstanding] men from the United States of America," said Holtgrieve, who was inspired by his father to play the game of golf. "The USGA has always been very special to me and this is something that my father always hoped I would be able to do. This would have made him very proud."

Holtgrieve was one of the country's top amateur players during the 1970s and 1980s and earned a spot on winning Walker Cup Teams in 1979, 1981 and 1983, where he had a combined record of 6-4. He also represented the USA on two victorious World Amateur Championship squads, in 1980 and 1982. A semifinalist at the 1980 U.S. Amateur and runner-up at the 1983 British Amateur, Holtgrieve won numerous state and district amateur titles in Missouri.

Holtgrieve played in five Masters Tournaments as an amateur — making the cut three times — and also qualified for the 1978 U.S. Open. He turned professional in 1998 and played on the Champions Tour from 1999 to 2005, where his top finish was a tie for second at the 1999 Home Depot Invitational. In all, he has played in four U.S. Senior Opens and a total of 42 USGA championships.

The USGA reinstated Holtgrieve's amateur status in 2007 after he played in 122 professional events. He also serves the USGA as a member of the U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship Committee. Holtgrieve resides in St. Louis, Mo.
