Squire Creek Country Club's golf course was designed by Tom Fazio and opened for play in 2002.

WHO CAN ENTER

The championship is open to amateur female golfers who have reached their 25th birthday by Oct. 3, 2015, and who have a Handicap Index® not exceeding 9.4.

ENTRIES

The USGA accepted 327 entries for the 2015 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur.

SECTIONAL QUALIFYING

Sectional qualifying, played over 18 holes, was conducted at 26 sites from Aug. 25 through Sept. 14.

2014 CHAMPION

Margaret Shirley, 28, of Atlanta, Ga., defeated defending champion Julia Potter, 5 and 3, at Harbour Trees Golf Club in Noblesville, Ind. Potter defeated Shirley the previous year in 19 holes at Biltmore Forest Country Club in Asheville, N.C. The final was the third rematch between the previous year's finalists in USGA championship history and Shirley became the fourth stroke-play medalist in championship history to win the title. WHAT THE WINNER RECEIVES

- A gold medal and custody of the Mildred Prunaret Trophy for one year
- Exemption from qualifying for the next 10 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championships
- Exemption from qualifying for the next two U.S. Women's Amateur Championships
- Exemption from qualifying for the next two U.S. Senior Women's Amateur Championships, if otherwise eligible

THE TROPHY

The U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championship Trophy is a sterling Revere bowl. It was presented in 1987 by Mildred Prunaret, who was chairman of the USGA Women's Committee from 1959 through 1963.

THE USGA AND LOUISIANA

The 2015 U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championship is the first USGA championship conducted at Squire Creek Country Club. It is the second USGA championship conducted in Louisiana, and the first in nearly 50 years. The 1966 U.S. Senior Women's Amateur Championship, won by Maureen Orcutt, was contested at Lakewood Country Club in New Orleans.

CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championship originated in 1987 as a result of a need determined by an ad hoc committee headed by Dena Nowotny, a member of the USGA Women's Committee. The Women's Mid-Amateur, the USGA's 13th championship, was created to provide a national competitive arena for amateurs age 25 and older.
