## Jeff Maggert Wins the 2015 Championship

Jeff Maggert, who often appeared ready to solve the perplexing U.S. Open puzzle only to come up missing a piece or two, finally claimed a national championship, winning the U.S. Senior Open by two strokes over defending champion Colin Montgomerie.

Buoyed by three straight birdies to begin the day, Maggert orchestrated a nearly flawless 5-under-par 65 at sun-drenched Del Paso Country Club to claim his second senior major of the year. He completed 72 holes in 10-under 270 to emerge from a pack of 16 players who started the day separated by only two strokes atop the leader board.

"I'm honored to take this trophy home, and I will cherish it the rest of my life," said an emotional Maggert, 51, whose family arrived in time to see Jeff win his third senior title – equaling his number of PGA Tour victories.

Montgomerie, who won his second straight Senior PGA Championship last month, didn't make a bogey in shooting a sparkling final round in his own right (66), but his string of eight pars to end the championship proved costly in his bid to be the first repeat winner since Allen Doyle in 2006.

"I must admit, I thought to get to 8 under would have been good enough, to be honest," said Montgomerie, 52, of Scotland. "All credit to Jeff Maggert for scoring what he's scored. Even at the start of the day, 5 under leading, I thought 8 might well be good enough. It's just unfortunate that it's come up a couple short. But that's nothing to do with me. That's Jeff Maggert's great play. And all credit to him."

Bernhard Langer, of Germany, the 2010 U.S. Senior Open champion, began the day sharing the 54-hole lead with Maggert, and he immediately jumped ahead with a 36-foot eagle putt on the par-5 opening hole. He was tied with Maggert after a birdie on the fourth, but bogeys ensued after poor drives at Nos. 6 and 8, and he never recovered. His 68 left him tied for third with Grant Waite, of New Zealand, at 7-under 273. Playing in his first U.S. Senior Open, Waite closed with a 67.

Another stroke back and tying for fifth were Billy Andrade and Lee Janzen, who were paired together and lit up the course for 63 and 64, respectively. Andrade's effort, with seven birdies and no bogeys, was the low round of the championship and tied for the second lowest round in a USGA Open championship (U.S. Open, U.S. Women's Open, U.S. Senior Open).

During an 11-year period starting in 1994, Maggert was a perennial contender in the U.S. Open, occupying the top 10 during a number of rounds and finishing in the top 10 seven times, including third place in 2002 and 2004. With a classic swing that emphasized accuracy, his game seemed tailor made for U.S. Open setups. But he admits he might have lacked the maturity to close out one of those championships.

His swing still delivers the ball onto fairways and greens – he hit 73.1 percent of the fairways on the weekend and missed just one on Sunday – but he's a more complete player at age 51. He never

trailed after the third hole on Sunday, and only a bogey on the long par-4 16th marred his scorecard. By then, however, he was three ahead, and he was able to close out the victory without much stress.

"Now that I'm an old guy," he said with a grin, "I've learned a lot and was able to just steady myself and play well."

"Jeff played outstanding. I was with him, obviously, all day. Saw every shot, and he played brilliant," said Langer, 57, fourth all-time in Champions Tour wins with 24. "He hardly ever missed. He was just striping it down the fairway and on the green and just the matter of making a putt or not. Fun to watch. I just didn't have my A-game today."

The three birdies to open the final round marked Maggert's second red-number run of the week. On Friday, he made a championship-tying five straight for another 65, and that streak, which came as he stood 2 over par, got him into the picture.

"Definitely, the five birdies in a row kind of took my tournament from a standpoint where it was looking like kind of a middle-of-the-pack week to those five birdies thrusting me out where: 'Hey, let's get your head in the game here. You're going to have a chance to win.' So that was definitely a turning point," he said.

With the victory, Maggert earns an exemption into the 2016 U.S. Open at Oakmont, where he finished tied for ninth in the 1994 championship. So he gets another shot at the national championship. Claiming the senior title shouldn't be viewed as a secondary accomplishment, however.

"Well, it's satisfying just because of the guys out here on the Champions Tour are the same guys that I was trying to beat 20 years ago, and they're great players," said Maggert, who won the Regions Tradition in May. "All of the game that these guys have is, I would say, almost just as good as it was 20 years ago. The thing that hurts us a little bit is our distance off the tee. Other than that, these guys are playing just as well as they were 20 years ago. Their iron play and their short game and their putting, they're just all fantastic players still. Tough to beat."

Kevin Sutherland, a Sacramento native, climbed within two of Maggert when he birdied the 15th, but a double bogey at the ensuing hole ended his chances. He ended up with a 68 and 275 total, good for a tie for seventh place with Tom Watson and Scott Dunlap, who each shot 69.

The leader after each of the first two rounds, Watson, 65, birdied the first hole from 6 feet for an early share of the lead, but the 1982 U.S. Open champion struggled to get anything going the rest of the way to be denied the one senior major he covets.

#### Weather

Mostly sunny, hot and a light southwest wind on Thursday with the temperature reaching 101.5 degrees at the course. Extreme heat again on Friday when the temperature climbed to 102.6. Mostly sunny and wind was still light out of southwest. Temperatures decreased to the high 90s on Saturday with sunny conditions and winds SSW 6-12 mph. On Sunday, clouds with light sprinkles of rain in the morning gave way to sun and temperatures in the low 90s and winds from the SSW at 5-10 mph, gusting to 12-15 mph.

Del Paso Country Club hosted its fifth USGA championship ... The U.S. Senior Open was held in northern California for the first time. California has hosted 75 USGA championships, second behind Pennsylvania (82) ... 11 Senior Open champions participated ... Twenty-seven amateurs were in the field, including 2014 U.S. Senior Amateur champion Pat Tallent ... More than 25 amateurs have competed in 10 of the last 11 U.S. Senior Opens ... There were 21 players in the field who were age 60 or older ... At age 71, 1999 U.S. Senior Open champion Dave Eichelberger was the oldest competitor ... Mike Finster, who turned 50 on June 17, was the youngest in the field ... Lee Janzen, the 1993 and 1998 U.S. Open champion, and Miguel Angel Jimenez, the 2000 U.S. Open runner-up, were among 54 first-time U.S. Senior Open competitors in the field ... The average age of the 156-player field was 54.80 ... 16 countries were represented ... North California native Bob Niger struck the first ball from the first tee at 7 a.m. PDT on Thursday ... At age 65, Tom Watson became the oldest first-round leader in the championship's history ... Hale Irwin played in his 20th Senior Open and is fourth all-time in most appearances ... Due to the 100-plus degree heat, caddies were given the option to forego wearing bibs for the first time at a U.S. Senior Open and 43 of the 156 caddies opted for that choice ... Mark O'Meara (right foot injury) and Steve Lowery (back injury) withdrew prior to Friday's second round ... In the second round, Jeff Maggert made five consecutive birdies on holes 15 through 1 to tie a U.S. Senior Open record, a feat that has been accomplished by eight other players... The 36-hole cut of 145 was the second-lowest in championship history; the cut was 144 in 2011 at Inverness Club, in Toledo, Ohio ... Seven U.S. Senior Open champions in the field made the cut: Brad Bryant (2007), Fred Funk (2009), Irwin (1999, 2000), Bernhard Langer (2010), Olin Browne (2011), Kenny Perry (2013) and Montgomerie (2014) ... Montgomerie, Janzen and Jimenez all made the cut after playing in the previous week's U.S. Open at Chambers Bay, in University Place, Wash. ... Perry, the 2013 champion, tied the sixth-lowest score in Senior Open annals with a 64 in the third round. Starting on the 10th hole, Perry birdied six of his first seven holes en route to a 28 on the outward nine, tying Tom Kite's nine-hole record set in 2012 ... Grant Waite tied for third with Langer and was three behind at 273 overall for the championship. Waite's performance was the best by a sectional qualifier since Don Pooley won the championship in 2002 ... Maggert won for the first time in 22 USGA championships played ... He twice finished third at the 2002 and 2004 U.S. Opens ... Maggert, who the season's first senior major, the Regions Tradition, Montgomerie and Langer have combined to win the last eight senior major championships ... Maggert was 2-over par for 23 holes to begin the U.S. Senior Open but played his final 49 holes in 12-under par ... Montgomerie's runner-up finish is the best performance by a defending champion since Allen Doyle won back-to-back in 2005 and 2006 ... Montgomerie has been a runner-up in four USGA championships, including the 1994, 1997 and 2006 U.S. Opens ... Watson, the 1982 U.S. Open champion, tied for seventh, his eighth top-10 finish. He joined Jack Nicklaus, Miller Barber and Irwin for most top-10 finishes in U.S. Senior Open history. Watson also eclipsed Nicklaus' record for most top-25 finishes with his 13th ... Irwin tied Arnold Palmer and Barber for most cuts made with 16 and moved to third in most played (72), trailing Palmer (83) and Barber (80) ... Langer has six top-10 finishes in eight Senior Opens, including the 2010 title ... Carter, who finished a 2-under 278, was the only other sectional qualifier among the top-15 finishers ... Mike McCoy, who shot a final-round 69, including eagles at holes 1 and 15, was the low amateur at the U.S. Senior Open for the second consecutive year. McCoy tied for 26th with a four-round total of 282 and tied Tim Jackson (2009) for lowest 72-hole score by an amateur in championship history ... Neal Lancaster aced the 168-yard second hole with a 7-iron and damaged the hole to the point where it could not be repaired ... A new hole location was moved 2½ feet to the left and the group on the teeing ground had to wait seven minutes while the new hole was cut ... The seven-day attendance total for the 2015 U.S. Senior Open at Oak Tree National was 115,006, including 26,498 on Sunday.

## **Championship History**

The first U.S. Senior Open Championship was played June 26-29, 1980, on the East Course of Winged Foot Golf Club in Mamaroneck, N.Y. The championship was conducted for golfers 55 and older, with a handicap limit of eight strokes for amateurs.

Established as a result of the remarkable growth in senior golf, both at the professional and amateur levels, the championship attracted 631 entries. The final two rounds of the U.S. Senior Open were broadcast live on national television beginning with the inaugural championship, and it has been telecast nationally ever since.

The 1980 field included former U.S. Open champions Lew Worsham, Julius Boros, Ed Furgol, Jack Fleck and Tommy Bolt. Former U.S. Amateur champion William C. Campbell was also a competitor. Roberto De Vicenzo, a national hero in his native Argentina, won with a 1-over 285, four strokes ahead of runner-up Campbell.

In 1981, the USGA lowered the age minimum to 50 to make the championship more competitive. The USGA also believed that lowering the minimum age would place the Senior Open in the mainstream of other senior competitions.

The second Senior Open was won by another national hero, Arnold Palmer, 51, at Oakland Hills Country Club in Birmingham, Mich. Palmer won in an 18-hole playoff with Bob Stone and Billy Casper. With his victory, Palmer joined JoAnne Gunderson Carner as the only players to win three different USGA championships (Jack Nicklaus, Carol Semple Thompson and Tiger Woods have since accomplished this feat).

In 1982, at Portland (Ore.) Golf Club, Miller Barber won the first of his three Senior Open titles. Barber shot a final-round 65 and set the 72-hole scoring record of 282. He also won the 1984 and 1985 championships.

Dale Douglass broke Barber's record in 1986 with a 72-hole score of 279. In 1987, Gary Player lowered Douglass's record by a remarkable nine strokes when he shot a 72-hole score of 270 at Brooklawn Country Club in Fairfield, Conn., to win. He was the only player to shoot four rounds in the 60s until Tom Weiskopf turned the trick in his 1995 victory on the Blue Course of Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Md.

Don Pooley and Tom Watson staged the first three- or four-hole playoff in 2002, after the format was installed in 1999. Pooley won with a birdie on the fifth hole. His 63 in the third round was the lowest score in Senior Open history until Loren Roberts shot a 62 in the third round at Prairie Dunes Country Club in Hutchinson, Kan. Besides Pooley, three others have shot 63s, including Kenny Perry en route to his title.

U.S. Open champions have performed extremely well in the U.S. Senior Open, winning 10 of the 30 championships. U.S. Open champions who have also won the Senior Open are Arnold Palmer (1960 U.S. Open; 1981 Senior Open), Billy Casper (1959, 1966 U.S. Open; 1983 Senior Open), Gary Player (1965 U.S. Open; 1987, 1988 Senior Open), Orville Moody (1969 U.S. Open; 1989 Senior Open), Lee Trevino (1968, 1971 U.S. Open; 1990 Senior Open), Jack Nicklaus (1962, 1967, 1972, 1980 U.S. Open; 1991, 1993 Senior Open) and Hale Irwin (1974, 1979, 1990 U.S. Open; 1998, 2000 Senior Open).
