Texas Wins the 2014 Championship

Texas captured a record-fourth USGA Men's State Team Championship on Thursday, posting a total score of 4-under-par 428 to edge Florida by three strokes at the par-72, 6,891-yard Pete Dye Course at French Lick Resort.

The trio of Zach Atkinson, Colby Harwell and Aaron Hickman entered the final round with a three-stroke cushion, and saw their advantage grow to as many as seven strokes early in the round, but a late charge by Florida briefly knotted things at the top of the leader board before Texas pulled away at the end. Texas posted a final-round score of 1-over 145, its highest of the championship, but a 1-under 71 from Atkinson provided enough cushion to claim the James R. Hand Trophy for the first time since 2007.

Iowa, the runner-up in 2012, finished third with a score of 2-over 434.

The win for Texas was a true team effort, as each player had two of his three scores count during the championship. Harwell's 75 was the non-counting score in the final round, but that didn't diminish the moment.

"That just tells you right there how strong Texas is. The three of us fought pretty hard for two years to get to this point. I'm really proud of all three of us for doing what we did and fighting it out all week," said Harwell, whose only experience competing in a USGA championship prior to the Men's State Team was in the 2013 U.S. Mid-Amateur. "To have my hands on a USGA trophy, I mean, this is just unbelievable. I can't believe that I've got my hands on one at all. I'm excited."

Atkinson made back-to-back birdies on the first two holes, contributing to Texas' big early lead, but soon faltered, playing Nos. 4 through 7 in 4 over par, a stretch that culminated with a double bogey on the par-5 seventh to all but negate his fast start. He didn't make another bogey the rest of the way, however, playing the last 10 holes in 3 under.

"I probably just beared down a little more. Last nine of a big tournament, USGA event, so, the stakes are high," said Atkinson. "I just tried to bear down and hit my targets and I did. I made a good 10-footer on 10, a little 10-footer that got me going. I didn't really miss a shot after that."

Atkinson's fifth and final birdie of the round came on the 18th hole when he made a short putt to seal the victory.

"I thought that was to tie if Gene [Elliott] from Iowa didn't make birdie," Atkinson said. "So, I had no idea that it was for a couple-shot victory. I might have coziered it down just a touch more. I don't know."

Hickman added a 2-over 74, the second counting score for Texas. Hickman, playing in his third consecutive Men's State Team, could not have been more thrilled to help rekindle his

team's traditionally strong play in the championship. Already the only state to have won more than twice, Texas had not finished higher than tied for 10th since its last victory in 2007, and Hickman was eager to change that.

"Every time you make it, it's special. It's hard to qualify for a team like this. In Texas, we have a ton of great players. To make the team and to be a part of a team that wins is amazing," Hickman said. "Being on the team three times, they start asking a lot of questions, when are you going to win one? When we get back, I can tell them I won one now. It's a pretty special day."

Florida, which entered the day in fifth place and six strokes back of Texas, made an early charge up the leader board, thanks in large part to Jon Veneziano. Playing in his fourth Men's State Team, Veneziano, 43, provided veteran leadership on a team that included 17-year-olds Sam Horsfield and Gabriel Lench. Veneziano provided clutch shots that kept Florida in the mix.

Veneziano, who defeated David Duval in the Round of 16 of the 1988 U.S. Junior Amateur, made an early double bogey before he righted the ship. He followed up a birdie on the par-4 sixth hole by holing out a 68-yard approach shot for eagle on the par-5 seventh and added another birdie on No. 9, giving him a 3-under 33 on the outward nine. He would go on to post a 2-under 70, combining with Lench's even-par 72 for a team score of 2-under 142, sealing Florida's third runner-up finish in the championship.

"We knew the wind was going to be an issue, so we just said let's go out there and do our best and try not to make big numbers, and hopefully one of us can play really well," Veneziano said. "We knew we had to get two scores under par if we were going to come and get the leaders, but this course is just so hard. It was fun, it was a great week."

Iowa was led by 2013 U.S. Mid-Amateur champion Mike McCoy, who bounced back from a second-round 77 with an even-par 72. The Hawkeye State has now finished in the top three in two consecutive Men's State Teams, while still searching for its first victory.

"Every shot is success or failure here. You just miss a shot and you're penalized significantly. It's really severe, you pay a price," said McCoy, who carded four birdies, but also had a double bogey on the par-4 fifth. "I knew we were close, we had to overcome some [bad] shots, we just didn't get it going. We were ready, we had our game faces on."

Louisiana and Puerto Rico tied for fifth with scores of 5-over 437. Louisiana was led by Brandon Aydtlett, who earned the championship's individual medalist honors at 3-under 216.

Weather

Clear skies and sun on Tuesday, with temperatures peaking in the low 80s, accompanied by light wind from the northwest. Notes

The win for Texas was their fourth in Men's State Team history. They entered the week as the only state to have won the championship three times ... All 50 states, plus Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico, were represented in the field ... Hawaii was the youngest team in the championship, with an average age of 17.7. Wyoming (51.3) was the oldest ... Hawaii's Andrew Chin (15) was the youngest player in the field, while Nebraska's John Sajevic (58) was the oldest ... Virginia's Keith Decker competed in the championship for the 11th time, the only player to have competed in every Men's State Team ... Nebraska's team included a father-son tandem in John and Andrew Sajevic ... The Men's State Team was the third 2014 USGA championship to be contested on a course designed by Pete Dye, joining the U.S. Senior Open (Oak Tree National) and U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur (Harbour Trees Golf Club) ... Defending champion New York tied for 17th, with none of the players on the 2012 squad competing ... There were four USGA individual champions in the field: Scott Harvey (2014 U.S. Mid-Amateur), Tim Hogarth (1996 U.S. Amateur Public Links), Mike McCoy (2013 U.S. Mid-Amateur) and Nathan Smith (2003, 2009, 2010, 2012 U.S. Mid-Amateur) ... Four players had previously competed on winning Men's State Team Championship squads: Decker (Virginia, 1995), Sean Knapp (Pennsylvania, 2009), Smith (Pennsylvania, 2009) and Bryan Norton (Kansas, 2010) ... Two players in the field competed in majors in 2014: McCoy (The Masters) and Will Grimmer (U.S. Open) ... Smith and Todd White were on the winning 2013 USA Walker Cup squad ... The Men's State Team was the second 2014 USGA championship held in the state of Indiana. The Women's Mid-Amateur was held at Sept. 6-11 at Harbour Trees Golf Club in Noblesville.

Championship History

The USGA Men's State Team Championship, as well as the Women's State Team Championship, grew out of the Association's centennial celebration in 1995. It was decided that a new championship, one in which each state could be represented by non-collegiate, amateur golfers, was a good way to cap the USGA's year-long celebration. The State Team Championship proved such a success that it has returned every two years.

The championship was fashioned after the biennial World Amateur Team Championships. Each state was invited to send three players; 46 states and Puerto Rico sent teams to compete at Lake Nona Golf Club in Orlando, Fla., in 1995, and 50 states and Puerto Rico sent teams to compete at SunRidge Canyon Golf Club in Fountain Hills, Ariz., in 1997. From 2001 to 2007 and from 2010 to 2014, 52 teams — all 50 states, Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia — participated.

State associations were given the option to choose their teams by any method. College players, however, were ineligible due to NCAA bylaws. Under current NCAA rules, a player may only participate in an international team match when that team is sponsored by the national governing body, such as in the Walker Cup Match. Otherwise, the player is faced with being declared ineligible for the remainder of the season of the infraction, as well as the following season.

Some states chose their players by a point system. Some selected the top finishers from their state championships or conducted qualifying tournaments. Other states empanelled selection committees that sifted through the year's results.

The first Men's State Team Championship, conducted Oct. 26-28, 1995, gave a decided advantage to Southern teams as it came beyond the competitive season for many states. The South Dakota team, for example, had left home with six inches of snow on the ground, and the Alaskans had not played since mid-September.

Based on the original World Amateur Team format, in which each team fields four players, with only the best three scores counted each of three rounds, Virginia prevailed in the inaugural championship. Minnesota, with nationally decorated amateur John Harris leading the way, won the 1997 event with a cumulative score of 416, 10 under par.

The lone individual prize is a bronze medal to the low scorer, but it is important that many of the best amateurs in the country have supported these early championships. In 1997, four members of that year's USA Walker Cup Team played, including Harris, and many USGA champions have represented their home state.
