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Child Care will be provided by O.C.L., Inc. for the 2019 U.S. Open Championship. The majority of the same teachers from Once Upon A Day Care, Inc. will return, and continue to be led by directors Karen Krzenski and Susie Thomas co-owners of O.C.L., Inc. Karen's company has been the child care provider for the 1995 – 1998 and 2001 – 2018 U.S. Open Championships. Susie joined the team in 1996. This is a complimentary service offered only to players' children and will be located at a child friendly, safe location near Pebble Beach. ### **Days and Hours of Operation**

In the best interests of all children, maximum recommended attendance for children is six (6) hours per day.

Program hours will be as follows:

**Monday, June 10 – Wednesday, June 12    8:00 a.m. – 5:30 p.m.**  
**Thursday, June 13 – Sunday, June 16    8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.**

### **Team Members**

The teachers and directors caring for your children are all team members of O.C.L. They are certified teachers, medical professionals (we travel with a pediatrician) or child care teachers. They have completed a background check in accordance with the U.S.G.A. The two Directors, Karen and Susie have both owned and operated their own daycare, taught in an elementary school, raised their children, and worked collaboratively since 1996.

### **Program Information**

O.C.L., Inc. will provide a unique program, with flexibility based on each child's needs. Quality, individualized care for the week will focus on safety, comfort, and activities which provide visual stimulation, creativity, as well as promote small and large motor development. The children will be grouped according to age as well as developmental abilities and needs. We will provide at least 3 different age groups.

***Parents will be asked to supply the following items based on the child/children's age:***

- All formula or breast milk and baby food as needed
- Diapers and wipes
- Changes of clothing
- Nap time comfort items (i.e. pacifier, sleep sac, blanket, comfort item....)
- All items must be clearly labeled with the child's name.

### **Meals**

Lunch, Dinner and two snacks will be provided at child care. A menu will be posted each day at the child care site. Please let us know during pre-registration if you have any special dietary requests and we will do our best to work with the caterers to meet your needs. If we cannot meet your child's dietary needs, you will be asked to provide the meals.

### **Security**

O.C.L. always operates under strict security guidelines. All caregivers will be wearing color coordinated attire as well as USGA identification. Two security guards and a police officer will be on site at all times for the safety of the children.

### **Arrival/Departure**

O.C.L. will require that any and all adults that the parent(s) authorize to pick up their child or children have a photo taken with the child or children at the child care site by one of the directors. These photos will be returned to the families on their last day or destroyed at the end of the tournament. In addition, anyone picking up a child or children will be required to show a photo identification.

For your child's safety, we require that a parent or other authorized adult bring your child/children into the building and into the appropriate classroom. Upon entering and leaving the building, you must sign your child/children in and out with a director. On the first day you will be asked to provide a contact number and authorized person will be given contact numbers.

### **Healthcare**

If a parent, teacher or director have a concern about a child's health the child may not be permitted at child care. Some of these symptoms would be.

- Undiagnosed rash
- 100.5 temperature
- Severe cold symptoms
- Uncontrolled diarrhea
- Red or runny eyed
- We have a pediatrician, Dr. Mark Thomas as well as a R.N. on staff if you have any questions, concerns or common medical illnesses.

### **Medication Administration**

If necessary, medication will be administered to your child under the following conditions:

- A signed permission form will be necessary for all prescription or non-prescription medication, including creams and ointments.
- Medication must be given directly to a director.
- Medication must be in the original container only.
- Medication must be accompanied by a clearly marked medicine spoon or dropper.
- When requested and supplied classroom teachers will apply sunscreen.
