



ANTI-DOPING POLICY AND DRUG TESTING PROCESS

Compliance with the drug testing program is a condition of entry to the championship. Any player who refuses to participate in the testing process may be subject to sanctions and disqualified. As such, you are responsible for complying with the Anti-Doping Policy, which includes submitting to drug testing upon request at the U.S. Open Championship. The USGA's Anti-Doping Policy incorporates the PGA TOUR's Anti-Doping Program.
