

## PUBLIC SAFETY

### **Medical / Law Enforcement / Security**

The Host Club should have a good working relationship with the local law enforcement agencies, the local fire response and emergency medical services. These three entities should work together to provide a safe and secure environment for the U.S. Amateur Championship.

The USGA and the Host Club will conduct pre-championship meetings with these three agencies and determine the most appropriate level of services to be provided.

#### **MEDICAL**

Medical services should be available at the championship. The following are the USGA requirements:

- Although the Host Club contract does not require an ambulance onsite, the USGA and the Host Club should discuss the local response for calls for ambulance transport. If local services are not immediately available, the USGA highly recommends having one onsite to immediately transport emergencies during the championship.
- A two (2) person team of Paramedics/EMTs that will have access to a stretcher golf cart to respond to emergency calls on the championship grounds. The minimum requirement for certification of Paramedics/EMTs is Basic Life Support (BLS) but Advanced Life Support (ALS) is highly recommended.
- A First Aid Station that will be staffed by at least one physician at all times. A physician assistant and/or registered nurse should be scheduled to assist the physician.
- Two AED defibrillators.
- Basic medical supplies as suggested by medical provider. (*see Exhibit A for a sample list*)
- Signage clearly communicating location of medical team.

**The USGA shall have direct communication via radio with the medical team.** Should there be a medical emergency on the course; the USGA will relay the type of emergency and the location to the medical staff over the radio. It is advisable, should an ambulance need to move onto the course, that a club staff member (Grounds or Golf) escort the vehicle to the exact point on the course.

A medical consent form and an incident report should be completed each time an attendee is treated by the medical team. Copies of those forms should be available to the Host Club and the USGA.

The medical team should develop a list of specialists (dentist, physical therapist, chiropractor, etc.) that would be willing to see a player during the championship on an immediate basis. The medical team should verify their credentials/certifications and only send players to these specialists after a referral from proper medical personnel. A system should be in place so that players can contact the medical team directly for referral to one of these specialists. The USGA must be notified of any emergencies.

#### **Stroke Play Co-Host**

The medical team should be available at the Stroke Play Co-Host from Friday through Tuesday. An ambulance should be onsite from Saturday through Tuesday. If local response time for ambulance services in the area is good, this ambulance can be optional. In either case, a stretcher cart with at least one paramedic/EMT (minimum of Basic Life Support certification) should be onsite. A first aid station should also be staffed by a physician and a physician assistant and/or registered nurse.

### **Wellness (Non-Medical) Services**

The medical team may also develop a list of general wellness (non-medical) specialists such as massage therapists, personal trainers, nutritionist, etc. for use by the players. To the extent possible, the medical team should verify credentials and certifications of each specialist prior to adding them to the list. These services should only be available to players if requested through the medical committee and should not be available within the player areas at the Host Club.

These wellness services may be provided to all attendees onsite only if available to the general public and given through the onsite medical team.

### **LAW ENFORCEMENT**

**Pre-Championship:** At a minimum, one law enforcement officer is generally present during practice rounds to provide a uniformed visible presence and respond as needed to anything on the grounds.

#### **Championship Rounds:**

1. One uniformed officer is generally present at the main admission gate that services general fans and other guests. This officer provides a uniformed visible presence and can help with any issues that arise, especially related to security screening and cash collection from ticket sales.
2. One uniformed officer is generally present at the clubhouse to support clubhouse services and assist in case any issues arise regarding access control and player security.
3. Based on potential crowd sizes, a minimum of two uniformed officers are generally assigned to golf course security, player security and crowd control as needed. These two officers can be assigned a cart but should refrain from following/watching golf unless a specific need arises.

USGA will notify the club, usually well in advance of the championship, if any player needs the service of plainclothes security while on the golf course. The USGA will fully explain the circumstances around such a request.

#### **Stroke Play Co-Host Course**

One law enforcement officer is generally present during the four days (two practice rounds and two stroke play rounds) to provide a uniformed visible presence and respond as needed to anything on the grounds.

***Please note: Additional officers may be needed to support traffic control on the exterior of the golf course and assist with finance/cash operations of merchandise, concessions, etc. as needed.***

### **SECURITY**

#### **Admission Gate Security Screening**

The USGA will work with the Host Club and local law enforcement agencies to take steps to maintain reasonable levels of security at the U.S. Amateur Championship. With this in mind and due to the events of the 2013 Boston Marathon, all championship attendees must adhere to the prohibited items list and refrain from bringing any of the items set forth below to the championship.

All attendees must clear a security screening process with an emphasis of prohibiting backpacks and bags larger than the set limit. All bags that meet the limit should still be searched by a trained security professional prior to entry. Individuals should not be cleared through the screening process with a

prohibited item in their possession. The list of prohibited items provided as a separate document and the USGA reserves the right to amend the list of Prohibited Items at any time to provide a safe and secure championship.

Any attendee that is deemed by the USGA and/or Championship Security Personnel to be willfully attempting to conceal a prohibited item and enter the championship may result in immediate expulsion and loss of ticket privileges for the remainder of the championship.

The USGA authorizes some individuals (USGA Staff, Rules Officials, Players, Media) to bring an oversized bag (larger than 6"x6"x6") into the U.S. Amateur Championship. A tag such as the below orange will be attached to the outside of each approved bag in a visible area. In addition to displaying this orange strip, the individual should also attach a personal identification tag (luggage tag) to the bag in the same visible area. The USGA provided identification tag (also orange) that can be used but individuals may use a similar tag that shows name, affiliation and contact information. All bags including approved bags are subject to search prior to entry at any admission gate.



### Access Control

In addition, private security guards may be needed to help control access to certain areas and facilities such as the below:

- Parking lot entrance
- Players' Locker Room entrances
- Clubhouse entrances
- Evening Club and Course Patrol (not required, but recommended) – typically found through local police or security companies

Training sessions with security guards or volunteers should be conducted detailing the important aspects of security at each specific area. In addition, credential boards should be printed for each security location with pictures of the specific credentials that are allowed to access the area.

Relative to the network compound, the television broadcast partner will consult with the Host Club to find out what security company the Host Club plans to use. The golf broadcast partner will pay for their security.
