  BERMUDAGRASS, ZOYSIAGRASS, AND

  CENTIPEDEGRASS BREEDING Brian Schwartz(UGA) An update will be given on a few of the most recent TifGrand installations. In addition, a report of the first year's findings of the USDA Specialty Crop Research Initiative grant funded towards the development of drought and salt tolerant turfgrasses will be presented. Also, the progress made during 2011 to make crosses and grow-out new zoysiagrasses from the Bladerunner/UGA germplasm collection will be highlighted, followed by a brief report of the improvements made for cold, high pH, and salinity tolerance in the centipedegrass breeding program.

grooming for athletic fields will also be covered.



An update will also be given on the water use and drought tolerance of DT-1 as compared to several bermudagrass cultivars.

> HERBICIDE RESISTANCE IN BERMUDAGRASS: **DEVELOPMENT AND EVALUATION - Austin Grimshaw-**An update on the development of ACCase herbicide

> resistance in bermudagrass through somoclonal variation in tissue culture will be given. Upcoming evaluation of AC-Case herbicide resistance in field and greenhouse spray tests using Segment (sethoxydim), FusiladeFX (Fluazifop), SelectMAX (clethodim) ACCase herbicides will also be discussed.

Trent Tate - This presentation will cover the levels of resistance found in 25 grasses to 2x and 6x Fenoxaprop (Acclaim Extra) applications and what mutations may have led to the resistant condition. Information gathered from this research is vital to the effective development of an herbicide resistant weed control system using herbicide resistant turfgrasses which is being developed at UGA.
