# Stewart Hagestad Wins the 2021 Championship

Stewart Hagestad warned anyone who would listen that the 36-hole final match of the 40th U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship was not over on Thursday, despite his 5-up advantage after 18 holes. On Friday, Mark Costanza proved Hagestad right by battling back to within one hole, nearly extending his opponent to the 36-hole limit before Hagestad captured his second title with a 2-and-1 victory at Sankaty Head Golf Club.

"[Costanza] gave me nothing the whole day," said the 30-yearold Hagestad, of Newport Beach, Calif., a second-year MBA student at the University of Southern California who improved his match-play record in this championship to 20-3. "I thought that at some point I would maybe get a break or he would give me a hole. I knew that he would come out swinging. He's a really good player. I tried to go out and basically make him beat me, and he damn near did that."

Costanza, 32, of Morristown, N.J., the 2020 Player of the Year in New Jersey and the Metropolitan Golf Association, had trailed by as many as seven holes on Thursday, but he chipped away at his deficit, closing to 5 down through 18. On Friday morning, with temperatures in the low 60s and winds gusting to 20 mph on Nantucket Island, Costanza held the honor from the first hole through the 17th, whittling his deficit from five holes to one before he failed to get up and down for birdie on the par-5 penultimate hole and Hagestad converted his own up-and-down for birdie to win the match.

"At one point I was 7 down, right, so to get it to 5 [down] – I wanted to get it to 3," said Costanza. "I said if I could get it to 3 at the end of the day yesterday would have been great. But to get it to 5 was satisfactory and gave me a chance. I knew I needed to get off to a good start."

Costanza showed no signs of the shakiness he exhibited Thursday afternoon in the early stages of the match. The 2012 graduate of St. John's University who was competing in just his second USGA championship won the 192-yard third hole on Friday with a birdie 2 and deftly converted several up-and-downs for par to keep his deficit manageable.

"It's tough because when you're digging yourself out of a hole, you want to make birdies, but you know if you falter, you're going deeper into the hole," said Costanza. "You've got to keep the momentum going. I think I kept the honor the entire day. I made some clutch up-and-downs and I'm proud of myself."

Costanza birdied No. 5 with a short pitch to 2½ feet and won No. 6 with a par to Hagestad's bogey from a bunker. After six straight halved holes (including Costanza knocking a tough bunker shot to 2 feet for a conceded matching birdie on No. 8), Costanza elicited a loud cheer with a 35-foot birdie on No. 13 to pull to within one hole.

The deciding stretch of holes came next, as Hagestad first could only watch, then successfully fended off Costanza's

charge. First, Costanza hit his tee shot just inside of 10 feet on the par-3 14th, but left his birdie try that would have deadlocked the match on the low side of the hole. They matched routine pars on No. 15 before Hagestad topped Costanza's 24-foot birdie on No. 16 with a 14-footer of his own, and Costanza left his pitch short of the hole on No. 17, settling for a par that kept him from extending the match to No. 18.

If there is one Costanza could have back, it is the birdie try on No. 14 that would have evened it up with four holes to play.

"I've had that putt probably six times in the last two or 2½ days," said Costanza. "Not on that hole, but just the same 10-footer, right to left, and it's funny, when I'm playing at home with my buddies or just free-wheeling it, the stroke is a lot more free. I even said to Meredith, I've got to keep my stroke free because I'm not letting that putter face open a little bit on the back, and I did it again there, and I left it low, just a little low."

The matching birdies on No. 16 showed the resolve – and the mettle – of both finalists.

"Kudos to Stew there," said Costanza. "I mean, that was huge. That was one of the biggest putts, if not the biggest putt I've made in my life, and he drained it right on top of me. So good for him. He's a great, great player."

# Notable


Costanza and his wife got married on Sept. 18, and they came to Nantucket a few days later to prepare for this championship, in which she caddied for him the entire way. Meredith was no stranger to the island, however, having vacationed here with her family since she was a child, in the village of Madaket. "I'm so thankful for her, and for her to be able to caddie for me has been amazing," said Costanza. "Nantucket has been a special place for her since she was a little girl. We've been up here multiple times, and we're going to continue to come here. Now for sure it's got a special place in my heart, too."

Stewart Hagestad played 121 holes of match play this week in earning the title, including a 23-hole match vs. Stephen Behr Jr. in the Round of 16. That total ties for the fourth-most since this championship went to a 36-hole final in 2001.


The 2021 championship had a record 5,339 entries, breaking the mark of 5,271 from 1997.

# **Championship History**

In 1981, the USGA inaugurated its first new championship for amateurs in 19 years, the U.S. Mid-Amateur. The Mid-Amateur, for amateur golfers of at least 25 years of age, provides a formal national championship for the post-college amateur, for whom the game is truly an avocation.

Before the arrival of the Mid-Amateur, the post-collegiate player could compete in the Amateur Championship, sometimes successfully, but these older amateurs faced greater odds. While they fit their golf around their work and families, they were most often competing against college golfers, for whom the game is close to a full-time activity.

Only about 40 percent of those who qualify for the U.S. Amateur each year are at least 25, although several have been quite successful. For example, Bob Lewis Jr., then 35, reached the Amateur final in 1980, and the semifinals in 1981 and 1986. Jay Sigel won consecutive Amateur titles in 1982 and 1983 (at ages 38 and 39, respectively), and then added the Mid-Amateur title in 1983, 1985 and 1987. In 1986, Buddy Alexander, 33, a reinstated amateur, won the U.S. Amateur and in 1993, 41-year-old John Harris won the Amateur. Harris remains the last mid-amateur to win the U.S. Amateur.

In general, however, most post-collegiate amateurs found themselves at a disadvantage competing against college golfers. Thus, the Mid-Amateur Championship was born.

Played at the Bellerive Country Club in St. Louis, the first Mid-Amateur drew 1,638 entries in 1981. The field included three former Amateur champions: Gary Cowan (1966, 1971), Marvin "Vinny" Giles III (1972) and Fred Ridley (1975). Jim Holtgrieve, 33, of Des Peres, Mo., defeated fellow Walker Cup Team member Bob Lewis Jr., 37, of Warren, Ohio, in the final, 2 up. Holtgrieve and Lewis each later captained a pair of USA Walker Cup Teams.

Nathan Smith is the only four-time U.S. Mid-Amateur champion. He won his first title in 2003 after his opponent, Bryan Norton, withdrew due to injury after nine holes. Smith took back-to-back victories in 2009 and 2010, and won his fourth title in 2012, becoming just the 15th person to win the same USGA championship on at least four occasions.

In 1983, Sigel became the first golfer in 53 years to win two USGA championships in the same year when he added the Mid-Amateur Championship to the U.S. Amateur he had won just 32 days earlier. Sigel became the Mid-Amateur's first two-time winner when he again captured the championship in 1985. Sigel won his third Mid-Amateur in 1987. Combined with his two U.S. Amateur titles (1982, 1983), Sigel won five USGA championships.

In 1987's first qualifying round, Don Bliss made holes-in-one on the eighth and 10th holes at Brook Hollow Golf Club in Dallas, Texas. Bliss is the only player to score two holes-in-one in one round of a USGA championship.

The U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship has continued to grow in popularity and in 1989 topped 3,000 entries for the first time. In its short history, the championship's unique age qualification has inspired similar tournaments throughout the country and there are now Mid-Amateur events in nearly every state. The Mid-Amateur also has helped several players earn berths to the USA Walker Cup Team. Sigel, Smith, Tim Jackson, Scott Harvey, Todd White, Danny Green, George Zahringer, William Hoffer and Stewart Hagestad are among those selected to represent their country off the strength of performances in the Mid-Amateur

For the first time in USGA championship history, two courses were used in a 36-hole championship match in the 2016 final between Hagestad and Harvey. The match at Stonewall, in Elverson, Pa., started with 18 holes on the par-70, 6,711-yard North Course, while the second 18 was played on the par-70, 6,870-yard Old Course.

Beginning in 2017, the U.S. Mid-Amateur champion received a full exemption from qualifying into the following year's U.S. Open field. Matt Parziale, a firefighter from Brockton, Mass., became the first player to earn that exemption.

In 2020, the U.S. Mid-Amateur was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
