Maja Stark Wins the 2025 Championship

Playing with the patience and precision reminiscent of another champion from Sweden, Maja Stark won the 80th U.S. Women's Open Presented by Ally on Sunday when she mastered the demands of Erin Hills and the challenge of the No. 1 player in the world close behind. The 25-year-old closed with an even-par 72 for a 7-under-par total of 281, and a two-stroke margin of victory over Nelly Korda and Rio Takeda from Japan.

Mao Saigo, Hyejin Choi and Ruoning Yin were at 284 with qualifier Hailee Cooper and Hinako Shibuno at 285. Angel Yin, Linn Grant and 2018 U.S. Women's Open champion Ariya Jutanugarn finished five back at 286.

Stark started the day one stroke ahead of qualifier Julia Lopez Ramirez, two clear of Takeda, Shibuno and Saigo with Korda three back. Her three-birdie, three-bogey performance was very much out of the playbook Annika Sorenstam used to win this championship three times, the last in 2006.

Stark played with great control and waited for others to make the mistakes. When she was in trouble, she made certain that bogey was the worst number she could make. She is the third Swede to hoist the Harton S. Semple Trophy, joining Liselotte Neumann (1988) and Sorenstam (1995-96 and 2006).

Stark is clearly a star on the rise, finishing T-2 in the 2024 Chevron Championship and tying for ninth in the 2023 U.S. Women's Open at Pebble Beach Golf Links. She now has nine professional wins after a standout college career at Oklahoma State.

"[This means] so much," said Stark. "Before this week, I was worried that I wasn't really going to play decent golf for a while because it felt like it was so far away. So this just feels huge."

The key moment came midway through the final round when a two-stroke swing was created by a Korda bogey on No. 13, the result of a three-putt and miss from 5 feet, and Stark converting a 14-foot birdie on No. 11. Both occurred almost simultaneously. That moved Stark three strokes clear of Korda, Shibuno and Takeda and she brilliantly protected the lead over the final four holes.

Stark showed off her steely nerves with a gutsy two-putt par from 50 feet. The 4-footer continued the momentum Stark had created following a two-putt birdie at the par-5 14th hole.

When she found trouble on Nos. 17 and 18, she minimized the damage by taking her medicine and making bogey when the results could have been far worse.

Saigo, the year's first major winner (Chevron), had held the lead at 8 under par after 36 holes, and briefly got to 9 under

after the third hole of Saturday's third round, a number no competitor reached until Stark's birdie on 14.

That Korda bounced back from a front-nine 40 in Saturday's third round to play the final 27 holes in 4 under par showed a grit and determination that put to rest her struggles in 10 previous appearances in this championship. Korda called her relationship with the U.S. Women's Open "complicated." She had missed the cut in three of her last five starts. The tie for second was her best U.S. Women's Open finish in 11 starts, which dates to 2013 when she competed as a 14-year-old amateur.

"Last year definitely put a dagger into my heart," Korda said about missing the cut at Lancaster Country Club. "But that's just golf. I mean, you're going to lose more than you win a majority of the time. I feel like I actually learn a lot about myself and my game and where I need to improve playing the U.S. Women's Open because it does test every part of your game. Maybe just a little bit of disappointment. But it's also super motivating."

Stark opened the final round with all pars until she rolled in a 20-foot birdie putt on the par-3 sixth hole to get to 8 under par. Saigo and Korda, playing two groups in front of Stark, both birdied No. 1, putting Saigo one stroke off the lead at 6 under par and Korda at 5 under par.

After a bogey on No. 6, Korda made back-to-back birdies on Nos. 7 and 8 with putts of 7 and 17 feet, respectively, to get to 6 under, tied for second place with Saigo and Shibuno, two strokes behind Stark. When Stark bogeyed the par-5 seventh hole, her lead was a single stroke over Korda and Shibuno.

Then came that key two-stroke swing a few holes later. Once she had the lead, Stark was both relentless and smart. An even-par final round was good enough for the victory and that's exactly what she did.

Sorenstam was only a year younger than Stark when she won her first professional championship at the 1995 U.S. Women's Open at The Broadmoor's East Course. That should be an inspiration for Stark to build on her success. She even received notes from both Sorenstam and Liselotte Neumann, who was the first Swede to take home the U.S. Women's Open in 1988.

"They texted me yesterday," said Stark after her round on Sunday. "[They said,] 'bring it home.' That was already cool to just get those texts."

Now she has a trophy to go with those messages.

Notable - World No. 1 Lottie Woad, of England was the low amateur at 293, two strokes better than University of Texas All-American Farah O'Keefe and recent Wake Forest graduate Carolina Lopez-Chacarra.

Championship History

The U.S. Women's Open was added to the USGA's roster of championships in 1953, 58 years after the first U.S. Women's Amateur. The reason for the USGA's relatively late assumption of the Women's Open is simple: women's professional golf is fairly new. When Opal Hill turned professional in 1938, she and Helen Hicks were two of the very few women golf professionals in the world.

Unlike the other 14 national championships conducted by the USGA, the Women's Open was created by another organization. In 1946, the short-lived Women's Professional Golfers Association introduced the Women's Open at match play at the Spokane (Wash.) Country Club. The Spokane Athletic Round Table, a men's fraternal organization, contributed the \$19,700 purse from its slot machines proceeds.

The first Women's Open was the only one conducted at match play. Patty Berg won the 36-hole qualifying medal in 1946, with rounds of 72-73—145, then won the championship by defeating Betty Jameson, 5 and 4, in the 36-hole final.

The small membership of the WPGA ran the championship for three years. By 1949, however, women's professional golf was making significant strides and the Ladies Professional Golf Association was founded. A group of 11 women, including Berg, Jameson, Louise Suggs and Babe Didrikson Zaharias, established the new association to provide organized tournaments for women professionals. The LPGA ran the Women's Open for four years, but in 1953 asked the USGA to conduct the championship. The first Women's Open under the USGA flag was played at the Country Club of Rochester, in upstate New York, where Betsy Rawls won the second of her four Women's Open titles (1951, 1953, 1957, 1960).

Conducted by the USGA ever since, the Women's Open is the oldest championship open to women professionals and amateurs. Rawls and Mickey Wright, the only other four-time winner (1958, 1959, 1961, 1964) were the championship's dominant players from 1957 through 1964, winning six Women's Opens between them during those eight years. In 1967, Catherine Lacoste, daughter of French tennis player Rene Lacoste and 1927 British Ladies Amateur Champion Simone Thion de la Chaume, became the only amateur to win the Women's Open.

In its 77-year history, the U.S. Women's Open has reigned as the world's greatest women's championship, attracting steadily increasing numbers of entries and spectators. Whereas only 37 contestants played in 1953, in 1976 the field jumped to 205 players and sectional qualifying was introduced. In 2001, a then-record 980 contestants entered. A four-day attendance

record of 41,200 was set in 1979 at Brooklawn Country Club in Fairfield, Conn. At the 50th Women's Open, in 1995, that record was more than doubled at The Broadmoor Golf Club in Colorado Springs, Colo.

In recent years, the U.S. Women's Open has truly become the world arena of women's golf. Since 1990, 17 championships have been won by international players, while only three of the first 41 champions were foreign-born. The emergence of the Women's Open as a great international contest came in 1987, when England's Laura Davies prevailed in an 18-hole playoff against Japan's Ayako Okamoto and JoAnne Gunderson Carner of the United States.

Annika Sorenstam won the second of her three U.S. Women's Open championships in 1996 and set a then 72-hole scoring mark of 272 (8 under). Juli Inkster matched that 72-hole score of 272, also setting a record in relation to par at 16 under, in 1999. In Gee Chun returned an 8-under 272 in 2015 at Lancaster Country Club, where she became just the fourth player to capture the Women's Open title in her first championship appearance.

In 2002, qualifying for the Women's Open was held in two stages for the first time — 18 holes for local qualifying and 36 holes for sectional qualifying. Since 2010, there has been one stage — a 36-hole final qualifier. Additionally, in 2014, the USGA held international qualifying for the first time in championship history. Qualifying was conducted at sites in the People's Republic of China, England, Japan and the Republic of Korea.

Entries for the U.S. Women's Open also have topped the 1,000 mark every year since 2004, illustrating the global growth of women's golf.


In 2020, the U.S. Women's Open was postponed from June to December due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Final qualifying was canceled which resulted in an all-exempt field. The 156-player field competed on two courses over the opening two rounds due to less daylight in the fall.

Minjee Lee established the 72-hole scoring record of 271 (13 under) with her four-stroke victory in the 2022 championship at Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club. In 2023, iconic Pebble Beach (Calif.) Golf Links hosted the championship for the first time and the purse was elevated to \$12 million the following year.
