# Ina Kim-Schaad Wins the 2025 Championship

Ina Kim-Schaad, 42, of Jupiter, Fla., claimed her second U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur title in dramatic fashion on Thursday, draining an 18-foot birdie putt on the fifth extra hole to defeat Hanley Long, 28, of Clarksville, Tenn., on Monterey Peninsula Country Club's Dunes Course. The victory came in recordsetting fashion — not only was the match the longest championship final in U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur history at 23 holes, but it capped a week that saw multiple milestones, including a record number of championship entries and the youngest field in championship history.

"I'm overwhelmed with emotion, honestly," said Kim-Schaad.
"I truly love this place, and my husband and I got married in Carmel. To do it at such a special place, golf course, with my family here and my husband on the bag, his birthday day week, and for a second time, it's like there's not even enough language to put around just all the feels that I'm feeling."

Kim-Schaad, who previously won the title in 2019, became the fourth-oldest champion in event history and the first twotime winner since Julia Potter-Bobb in 2016. The victory also marked her 20th USGA championship appearance.

The final match was tight from the start. Kim-Schaad struck first with a win on the opening hole, but Long answered immediately by taking the second. The two halved the next four holes, highlighted by Long's remarkable par save on the par-4 sixth, where she found both the rough and the greenside bunker before holing a clutch putt to stay tied.

Kim-Schaad would win the seventh and ninth holes, the latter with a birdie, to take a 2-up lead. But Long fought back, capturing Nos. 11 and 12 to tie the match once again.

"It was an absolute battle out there the entire day," said Long, the 2019 Tennessee Women's Amateur champion. "Honestly, I'm just so proud of my grit and determination throughout the entire day, keeping my head up and held high and never giving up."

The back nine became a seesaw battle. Kim-Schaad reclaimed the lead on the iconic par-3 oceanside 14th when Long missed a short putt for par, but Long answered by winning the 15th. Kim-Schaad pulled ahead again on 16 after Long found the dunes to the right of the fairway, only for Long to respond on 17 when Kim-Schaad's approach flew the green and she was forced to play her third shot from a cart path.

Both players bogeyed the par-4 18th to send the match to extra holes. The duel continued deep into the afternoon, with Long rolling in an 18-foot par putt on the second extra hole to keep her hopes alive.

On the 23rd hole, Kim-Schaad finally broke through, holing an 18-footer for birdie to secure her second Mid-Amateur title, six years after her first.

"I kind of figured it was going to be a war of attrition," said Kim-Schaad. "The pins where they were today, you could not get on offense. It just felt physically impossible to be on offense. So, playing defensively, playing patiently and just letting the things happen and be a war of attrition was mentally where I had to put myself, and I was ready to play 36 if it had to be."

#### Notable

The 23-hole final was the longest final match in championship history, surpassing Robin Weiss' 22-hole victory over Page Marsh Lea in 1989.

Ina Kim-Schaad becomes the sixth player to win multiple U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur titles.

Runner-up Hanley Long received a silver medal as well as exemptions into the next three U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championships, a spot in the 2026 U.S. Women's Amateur and an exemption into the 2026 U.S. Women's Open Presented by Ally.

Next year's U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur will be contested at Montclair Golf Club, in West Orange, N.J.

Long has a unique history with the USGA. She served as an operations intern for the 2018 U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills Golf Club. The U.S. Open will return to Shinnecock in 2026.





# **Championship History**

The U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur Championship began in 1987 as a result of a need determined by an ad hoc committee headed by Dena Nowotny, a member of the USGA Women's Committee.

The Women's Mid-Amateur, the USGA's 13th championship, was created to provide a national competitive arena for amateurs age 25 and older.

By 1987, it had become increasingly difficult for female amateur golfers beyond college to compete equitably with their collegiate counterparts, for whom golf was nearly a full-time vocation. One must go back to 1973 and Carol Semple Thompson to find the last career amateur to win the U.S. Women's Amateur.

As with any new championship, there was initial concern with the level of entries. In this case, women amateurs responded with enthusiasm. The first championship attracted 320 entries, only 29 fewer than the number that had entered the 1987 Women's Amateur a few weeks earlier.

The starting field of 135 players was determined by sectional qualifying. The first Women's Mid-Amateur was played at Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa, Okla., and was won by Cindy Scholefield, 27, of Malibu, Calif.

The Women's Mid-Amateur has been the setting for a number of noteworthy finals. In 1989, Robin Weiss, of Palm

Beach Gardens, Fla., defeated Page Marsh Lea on the 22nd hole. In 1990, despite the tremendous pressure of competing on her home course as a crowd favorite, Carol Semple Thompson, 41, of Sewickley, Pa., defeated Marsh Lea, 3 and 1, at the Allegheny Country Club, where Semple Thompson had learned the game.

Two women have won the Women's Mid-Amateur on four occasions. In 2011, Ellen Port, of St. Louis, Mo., captured her fourth championship title with a 2-and-1 victory over 2009 champion Martha Leach at Bayville Golf Club in Virginia Beach, Va. Having previously won in 1991, 1993 and 2000, Port's 11-year span between victories broke the record of seven years, set by Thompson in 1997.

The following year, Meghan Stasi, of Oakland Park, Fla., won her fourth Women's Mid-Amateur, taking a 6-and-5 victory over Liz Waynick at Briggs Ranch Golf Club in San Antonio, Texas. She won back-to-back titles in 2006 and 2007 under her maiden name of Bolger, and also took the victory in 2010.

Sarah LeBrun Ingram, of Nashville, Tenn., in 1994 became the first player to take consecutive Women's Mid-Amateur championships. She had previously won in 1991 and 1993.

In 2020, the U.S. Women's Mid-Amateur was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
